This month of November we have much to be grateful for. Thomas Paine said, "Those who expect to reap the blessing of freedom must undergo the fatigue of supporting it". Many among us have born that burden to main-



tain peace. Veterans Day, was originally set as Armistice Day to honor the end of WWI in 1918. Legislation that was passed in 1938 that "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to here after celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'. After WWII and the Korean War the 83rd congress, after being urged by the veterans service organization amended the act of 1938. The amendment struck out the word "Armistice" and inserted the word "Veteran". For this we thank you for your voluntary service of our great nation. In 2010 brother Ed Harris wrote an article for Scottish Rite Supreme on aid and assistance. Ill Bro. Harris stated "Many deserving Veterans who are eligible may be unaware of this valuable pension". The article gives direction to receive assistance for government aid for Veteran programs.

There is an interesting historical date on the 5th of November, and this is known as Bonfire Night. In 1605, the King passed laws against the Catholics, and this was not taken lightly. Guy Fawkes and a group of plotters attempted to blow up the House of Parliament in London in retaliation. There were 36 barrels of gunpowder smuggled into a house rented next to the House of Parliament. Physicists explain that blast would have covered a 500 meter radius. In response to this act a bonfire was ordered by King James to celebrate his survival.

Fraternal greetings! We had a wonderful Octoberfest style dinner at the October meeting, and I encourage those of you who haven't attended a Scottish Rite stated meeting and Dinner to please consider doing so. We always love to see our Scottish Rite Brothers, their significant others, and Friends at our events! Please also consider inviting any Master Masons who haven't been through the Scottish Rite to attend the No-



vember Dinner, along with their application for the November Reunion.

As I write this article, we have just passed through October the 13th. October the 13th is a special time of year which marks the persecution of the Knights Templar by Pope Clement V and Philip "The Fair" IV, King of France. This is a time of year where we are reminded of our mission as Scottish Rite Freemason's of our responsibility of fighting despotism and injustice wherever it might exist, as well as our time of solemn morning for all the Great Masters who have been persecuted for their cause of Freedom, Love, and Justice in the past.

Additionally, this year commemorates the 900th year anniversary of the establishment of the Knights Templar as an organization in 1118AD. After the official disbanding of the Knights Templar on October 13, 1307, 711 years ago, the Knights Templar organization changed into an underground organization which is argued to still exist to this day. Charged with the mission of protecting ancient knowledge, holy relics, and other items from antiquity possibly including the Arc of the Covenant.





How did the Knights of Saint Andrew start?

The origins of the Order date back to the period of 1220-1232 AD, when a Confraternity was established in the City of Acre, of the then Crusader Latin Kingdom of Jerusalem (occupying the same territory as the modern state of Israel) to protect pilgrims and merchants.



This Confraternity, consisting of burgesses and knights of largely French heritage, met in the City's Castle and chose the Holy Apostle, St. Andrew, as their Patron. They constituted themselves as a Crusading Order of Knights with the object of resisting tyranny and protecting public safety. **During the turmoil of the Sixth Crusade,** these worthies of the Order defended the poor, the sick and the weak from adversaries. In the best tradition of the Military and Religious Orders of the time, they founded their lives on prayer, charity, service and protection.

About this time, possession of Acre was being contested by the Holy Roman Emperor, Frederick II operating from his base in Sicily. Through his marriage to Yolande, daughter of John of Brienne, a leading Crusader, the Emperor had become embroiled in the affairs of the Crusader states. The Emperor sent a fleet of ships against Acre in 1227, whereupon the Knights and Officers of St. Andrew of Jerusalem appealed to Pope Gregory IX, who excommunicated the Emperor for this action. During the subsequent negotiations with the Muslims by the Emperor Frederick, the Knights of St. Andrew remained aloof. Though some progress for the Crusaders appeared at first to have seen made, their adherence to treaty commitments made at that time eventually enabled an army of Turks in pay of the Sultan of Egypt, to crush the remaining Crusader enclaves by about 1244.

It was at about this juncture that the existing historical records of the Knights of St. Andrew were lost. It is speculated that the records may have been transported to the Byzantium in hope of safekeeping, only to be lost yet again when the city fell to the Turks in 1453.

Fifth Degree — Perfect Master III. Dani

The Lodge of Perfection degrees, as they tell you in the 14th Degree lecture, perfect or complete the work of the Symbolic Lodge. That means Degrees 4 through 14 flesh out the story and lessons of Degrees 1 through 3.

In the Fourth Degree, Secret Master, we found the Lodge clad in sorrow for the death of Hiram Abif. The lesson are secrecy, obedience, and fidelity.

You remember that, in the Blue Lodge, they raised Hiram's body from the grave where the miscreants buried him, and took it to the Temple and buried it under the Holy of Holies. The Master's lecture described the beautiful and symbolic marble monument erected there.

This is one of many instances where the Masonic story is clearly not historic. At the time of Solomon's Temple, the Israelitish people followed strict purity laws. Dead bodies, among other things, are ritually unclean. If you touch a dead body is not a sin, that is, an offense toward God. But that action would render you unclean or unworthy to participate in sacred rituals of the Temple. Consequently, bodies were buried in tombs outside the gates of the city. If you visit the Old City of Jerusalem today, you can see a collection of tombs outside the east wall.

In addition, the Third Degree ceremony does not make any mention of a funeral service for the distinguished craftsman and martyr. The Fifth Degree, Perfect Master, symbollically creates a funeral service for the slain Hiram Abif.

From 1883 to 1935, when they presented this Degree, they required each Candidate to make out his last will and testament. They no longer do that because a last will and testament is too important to write on-the-fly before a Masonic Degree. While you can write your own will without legal advice, it is not a good idea. That is because you would write your will in English. However, judges and lawyers speak Legalese, a language that uses many English words but is full of different and unexpected meanings. To be sure your heirs get what you intend for them, obtain legal help from a licensed practitioner.

But the point of the lesson is clear. You're going to die someday. And you need to record instructions for those who survive you. That includes a will, but may also include one or more trusts, as well as how you title assets like your home and your retirement accounts.


The Lodgeroom for this Degree is set up differently from the Blue Lodge. The Venerable Master sits the East, but the role is filled by Adoniram ben Abada, who supervised the workmen on Mount Lebanon, where they harvested timber for the Temple. After Hiram's death, Adoniram was promoted to Chief Architect of the Temple in Hiram's stead, and presumably relocated to Jerusalem.

The Senior Warden is Zabud ben Nathan, the Prime Minister, who reports to King Solomon. In those days, he would have held the title of Vizier. The Senior Warden's seat is in the Northwest corner. The Junior Warden's seat is in the Southwest corner but nobody sits there. The Orator sits in the North. There is no officer's chair in the South.

King Solomon and HIram, King of Tyre appear later in the story and they perform the funeral rites. The cast and Candidates later form in procession and march slowly to the tomb, giving the Due Guards and Signs of the Three Degrees along the way.

The Candidates promise to forgive each other of any offenses and to atone and make reparation to any they may have harmed in the past. Afterwards, the exemplar gives up the white robe he wore as a novitiate, and is invested with the collar, apron, and jewel of a Perfect Master.

Liat's Mother wanted to say a few words about her experience at our clinic:

"I heard of the San Jose Scottish Rite Clinic from a friend. At the time, my daughter was unable to enunciate several letters properly. For example, her "r" sounded like a "w," as she would say, "wabbit" instead of "rabbit." Although it took 1.5 years of weekly visits and some home practice, Liat's progress with Ms. Jenna was definitely worth the wait! Not only is Liat's speech easier to understand, she is also more confident when speaking up at school. The clarity of her words will certainly help with her day to day conversations and public speaking. The intimacy of a smaller clinic allowed for a more personal experience. However, the most rewarding part of receiving services here was the ability for Liat to establish a personal relationship with Ms. Jenna. Furthermore, practicing speech through "play" made her feel like it was "game time." Due to these circumstances, my daughter looked forward to attending speech therapy each week. We are incredibly grateful for the Scottish Rite Clinic and Foundation. If not for the Rite Care Clinic's probono services, acquiring speech therapy via our insurance would have had a significant financial impact on our family.
