hen I was first appointed the position of Personal Representative in 2007, I did have some working idea of the ramifications of the job, and with the help of Ill. Leo Mark, 33°, Ill. Dalton Noland, 33°, and a dedicated staff, both paid and volunteer, I worked my way into the chair without too much difficulty. The ideas I had were simply to work with the members, keep a good set of books

and records, support the Clinic, and adhere to the rules

But there was something else that needed to be done to make the San Jose Scottish Rite an organization the people look up to and admire. After all, if we can't maintain the respect of the Masonic community, it would impossible to attract members, new or old, and the Valley would surely die. I wanted to make San Jose Scottish Rite a vibrant, dynamic organization to which Masons would want to belong.

I reflected on all this, and one of the first things I did when I was appointed was to implement something taken from the pages of my old Sheriff's plan book. I created a "Think Tank" group to meet weekly and look for solutions to some of the problems we were facing. I thought about the eara of a great Mason, Past Grand Master of Missouri, and President of the United States, Ill. Harry Truman, 33°, and took the name of one of his advisory groups, the "Kitchen Kabinet" for the Valley of San Jose.

I looked for members who could attend a weekly meeting, who would take an interest in the work, and who had the willingness to "get involved". Many of our dedicated members started attending our Tuesday Morn-

ing meetings and did exactly as I had hoped. We have added and lost some members along the way, but the Kabinet is essentially intact and functioning well.

Some of the ideas we have come up with were rejected before we even got them out of the box; some we have tried and discarded; some are now in practice and working well. Some are still in

stages of infancy with an uncertain future, but the point I'd like to make here is that our group is willing to experiment, work hard, and reach out for even newer ideas, all within the spirit of "friendship and brotherly love that reinforces the meaning of the term.

While the "Kabinet" conversation among the members is not always just Scottish Rite business; and while there is a fair amount of humor and horseplay that accompanies the discussions, we do get things done, owing to the dedication of the members to the ideals of Freemasonry. Sometimes we throw chairs or kick over tables, (to the chagrin of our General Secretary) but we still progress. The special events we enjoy; the innovations in the agenda; some of the ideas in the degrees; and a host of other improvements in the life of the Valley of San Jose are products of the industry and energy of this hard working group.

One other thing I would like to say about the "Kabinet". It is <u>not</u> a closed organization attended only by invitation. Any member who wants to attend, who has the time an interest and is willing to work for the betterment of the Valley is welcome to join us. Try it!! You won't be disappointed.

From the Secretary's Table:



I t is now the time of year to anticipate the preparation of our budget for operations for the next year so that you may have it for consideration before the next annual election of officers.

Several items present themselves quite dramatically for your consideration.

- Annual Dues It is not possible to anticipate the number of members who will pay dues for a year by merely using the number of members times the annual dues amount. The number of brothers who are not able, or are not interested, seem to change each year. For the coming year (without any input from you), I will use a factor of only 80% of the above equation. This year I used the factor of 95% and was seriously in error. If you disagree, let me know please.
- Stated Meetings and Reunions This has always been a moving target but the current economy, it appears to be impossible to make a commitment to make a reservation for our Scottish Rite events. Beginning immediately, we will begin having a split level event cost. On price with a reservation and a higher price for those who attend without a reservation. Adopting this policy may reduce the amount of guessing that the office staff does and still leave flexibility in the ordering of meals and related costs.

I would request that you call me directly with any input about programs you may want the Scottish Rite to adopt and put into the budget. The Council of Masters would really appreciate any comments from you.

Clinic Director's Message:

The San Jose Scottish Rite Children's Language Disorders Clinic helped
56 children in June and completed over

241 treatment hours. In anticipation of absences due to summer schedules we were able to take two children off of the waiting list for summer treatment. In addition, one child's service was increased to two times per week secondary to severity. We are continuing to receive calls from parents interested in our services. The clinicians are trying to assist some of these parents by referring them elsewhere for possible help. With 95 children on our waiting list we unfortunately cannot add any more at this time.

During this past month, we have received several donations of toys from parents, gifts that are always appreciated. One parent recently wrote a quick note to express his thanks for helping Brian, a 5-year old boy who is having difficulty with his "I" and "th" sounds. Brian started treatment in March 2010 and has been making exceptional progress.

I would like to thank Kathie Runcie for her donation to the Hammond Fund for our clinic.

As your Clinic Director, I continue my efforts to encourage the Foundation Board to fund hiring another clinician, so that we may start to help more children. In addition, the Foundation Board is currently reviewing my request to purchase up-to-date testing and training materials at a cost of \$2,200. These items are on the top of our updated list of needed items for the Clinic, which includes an additional computer, monitor and black & white printer for use by the clinicians while our current computer is being used by children for training.

I am also putting a team together, with Ill. Bob Winter's blessing, to clean up the clinic, repaint the walls and bathrooms, etc. The clinic could also use new blinds and bookshelves. If you are interested in helping with this project and/or donating some items, please contact me.

From the Clinic!!!

lexa is a charming 9 year old girl who has been attending the San Jose Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic once per week to treat her articulation and language skills. Alexa was originally evaluated by her school; however she currently attends a school where speech and language services are not offered. Therefore, the only treatment she now receives is here in this clinic. Alexa's mother was referred to the San Jose Scottish Rite by a family member who works at the Scottish Rite in Stockton. Alexa and her family travel each week from San Mateo to San Jose for her therapy appointment. Their dedication and hard work have played a great

role in Alexa's speech and language progress and success!

Alexa has been coming to therapy once per week along with her twin sister Angeli (featured in the June 2010 newsletter.) She and her sister have been seen for a group session, as many of their treatment goals have been the same. It is not uncommon for twins to require help with developmental skills such as fine and gross motor as well as speech and language skills. We usually contribute this to the fact that twins are often born prematurely, which increases the likelihood of need for therapeutic services. Angeli and Alexa were not born prematurely, however like many other children they had the need for speech and language therapy.

When Alexa first began treatment at this clinic, her parent's main concern was the production of her speech sounds. Her mom stated, "It was very difficult for her to say certain words and sounds. It became very frustrating for her and she would just give up." Her treatment began with goals targeting sounds such as /s, sh, ch, th, v, r and j/. Alexa also had difficulty with /r/ blends found in words like "grapes" and "princess" and /s/ blends, like "smell" and "spike."

Alexa is currently working of the /er/ sound found in words like "under" and "painter." She has had difficulty with the strength and coordination of her jaw, lips and tongue, which is required to produce the "er" sound. Alexa has completed various oral motor exercises and uses verbal, visual and tactile cues to help her produce the "er" sound. Alexa's mother stated, "Her pronunciation of words has improved so much. She is still working on her "er" sound and is more confident



about saying them correctly. She has become more aware of her errors too." Alexa is also working on language and grammar based treatment goals. She sometimes has difficulty with the rules of grammar and word order when constructing her sentences and questions in conversation. Her treatment has targeted the verbs is/are, was/were, has/have, plurals, past tense verbs and pronouns.

Alexa's mother Cynthia stated, "It was very difficult to understand Alexa before she came to this clinic. Now, with patience and dedication on our part along with her, we

understand her much better. We have her repeat her words or sentences in order to help her express herself better." She also reported that, "Everyone is so helpful and friendly at the clinic. I would like to thank Angela for all her help, support and dedication in helping my twin girls. They've shown so much improvement. Although it's a long drive for us, my girls look forward to coming to speech every week. They are happy and enjoy their time here. They've even seen a big difference in their own speech!"

Whenever someone asks me why we still have secrets in our organization, since everything is available on the Internet, I always tell them that, "Yes, there's a wealth of information about Masonry on the Internet – and some of that information is accurate."

Recently, this got me to wondering what people were saying about us online. A quick search of the web turned up some fascinating supposedly "facts:"

- 1. Albert Pike organized the Ku Klux Klan in Arkansas after General Forrest appointed Pike the Grand Dragon of that Realm. He also wrote the anti-black manual for the southern United States.
- 2. Freemasonry was founded in England in the early 1700's by the Venetian party who were also responsible for the East India Company, the royal African Company of slavers, and the slave colony of South Carolina.
- 3. The Scottish Rite of Freemasonry has a feudalist lore and legend that is rooted in the black slave trade through the Caribbean Islands.




