


#### From the Personal Representative



ole is a fun-loving II year old boy who has been attending the San Jose Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic since the spring of 2016. Cole was admitted to our program due to concerns with his articulation. He was diagnosed with a mild articulation disorder primarily impacted by distortions of the /r/ phoneme. The /r/ phoneme is expected to be mastered in a child's sound system by the time they are seven years of age.

Cole's parents are very thankful for the services he has received through the San Jose Scottish Rite. His mother reported that Cole's school has not had a Speech and Language Pathologist on staff since last year. Thus, Cole was not receiving the services that he needed through the school district. Thankfully, Cole's parents knew about our clinic because his younger brother, Samuel, had attended



our program and graduated this past fall. It is these situations that remind us how valuable our services are for the community. Without the continued support of the San Jose Scottish Rite and its members Cole and his family would be without help.

Cole has made excellent progress in the past six months! He is a hard worker and it shows in how he far has come since he first started treatment! I am looking forward to continuing to help Cole in the New Year! Thank you San Jose Scottish Rite members for supporting the families and children in our community. We are grateful for your leadership, compassion, and stewardship!




