THE SYMBOLISM OF THE SQUARE AND COMPASSES

You were introduced to the square and compasses very early in your Masonic career in fact they were among the first items discussed on your night of Initiation. They are in evidence throughout all Lodge meetings, and it is therefore desirable that you should have a ready understanding of their Masonic signifi-

cance.

The dictionary defines "emblem" as a symbol, while "symbol" is an emblem, but typifying a special quality of concept. It adds that a symbol implies a transfer of meaning from the physical emblem to an idea by means of an allegory or metaphor.

This is not confusing when you consider that the letters of the alphabet are symbols and when combined into words they convey all kinds of meanings to you, the amount depending upon your knowledge. They convey meanings because you recognise them and can associate them with understandable facts and experiences. Until this is so, the meanings are hidden: if you cannot read, the messages are lost.

So it is in Freemasonry, which is illustrated by symbols. The symbols of Masonry are used to reveal its meanings, not to conceal them but they will remain concealed until one can read the symbols, and understand them, and can recognise and interpret the message contained in each one.

So when we talk of the symbolism of an emblem we are looking for the metaphor of transferred meaning associated with it.

The square, the compasses, and the square and compasses combined have long been accepted as Masonic symbols to teach Masons to "square their actions and to keep them within due bounds". The fact that these emblems enjoy universal recognition of what they stand for was proved in a celebrated court case in the USA in the 19th Century when it was ruled that the sign of the square belonged exclusively to Freemasonry.

Brethren.

Our installation started a new Scottish Rite year. The Masters and officers will start planning activities for 2023. Keep reading the Rite Word for details and plan to take part.

Our February stated meeting and dinner falls on Valentine's Day this year. I, for one, observed this day back in elementary school. A question, though, is who was this Saint Valentine?

Valentine, a physician-priest cured the sight of the daughter of an officer of the Praetorium, who had been blind for 2 years. Valentine got in trouble with the emperor, however, by helping Christian couples to wed when Roman law prohibited young couples from marrying. Roman emperor Claudius II sentenced him to death around 269-270 A.D. when persecution of Christians was common. It is said on the day of his execution, February 14, he sent a note to the girl he cured signed "from your Valentine".

Often Saint's days were merged with pagan holidays to help gain converts. There was a pagan Roman festival held February 13-15 called Lupercalia, a fertility festival. Valentine's feast day was established as February 14 in 496 A.D. by Pope Gelasius I. The holiday shows up in Chaucer's poem "Parliament of Fowls" and in Shakespeare's Hamlet.

Valentine's Day became commercialized in 1840 when Esther Howland, daughter of a Massachusetts stationer, mass produced cards. Those first cards were rectangular with fancy lace, poems, cherubs, hearts, birds, flowers, and other images associated with the day. At the same time, there was criticism in popular literature against pricy cards. Some felt a husband spending his hard-earned wages on the trivial cards was not a good sign for the marital road ahead.

That Victorian criticism aside, this is truly a day to show our appreciation to our sweethearts with cards, flowers, candy and even dinner out. The San Jose Scottish Rite includes our sweethearts, the spouses of our departed brothers, at our February stated meeting dinners. Don't forget to show your appreciation to your special sweetheart on the 14th.

Kabbalah, the Beginning Continues

Last time, we learned about Ein Sof, the limitless inconceivable reality concealed by nothingness.

Ein Sof, being unlimited in every aspect, had to go through a process of contraction (Tzimtzum) in order to manifest in a limited, material capacity and pursue the work of creating a physical universe.

The first thing manifested from Ein Sof is Aur (Hebrew for "light"). We consider this kind of light to be a form of energy that provides the material and power to build the universe and set it into motion.

The next thing manifested from Ein Sof is a collection of ten of Divine qualities. They come as Sephiroth (nodes or spheres), in three sets of three, followed by a single Sephira at the end. Each Sephira has a Hebrew name and acquired a color and number.

Stage I


The first set of Sephiroth emanates: Kether (Crown), white, 1; Hochma (Wisdom), gray, 2; and Binah (Understanding), black, 3.

The second set of Sephiroth emanates: Hesed (Mercy), blue, 4;

Geburah (Strength), red, 5; and Tiphereth (Beauty), yellow, 6.

The third set of Sephiroth emanates: Netzach (Victory), green, 7; Hod (Glory), orange, 8; and Yesod (Foundation), purple, 9.

Finally, a single Sephira emanates: Malkuth (Kingdom) it has four colors, red, blue, green, and yellow; 10. Malkuth is the platform on which Humankind stands.



Stage 2


Initially, the Sephiroth are isolated from each other within shells, called Qlippoth. Then the Qlippoth shatter. The resulting shards introduce and distribute negative or evil energy into existence.



Stage 2: The Qippoth shatter.

Stage 3

Without the isolation, the ten Sephiroth form 22 lines of communication among themselves. This is the Kabbalistic Etz Chaim or Tree of Life. The 10 Sephiroth plus 22 lines form what is called the "32 Paths of Wisdom".




Stage 3: The Sephiroth form 22 paths of communication.

Stage 4

Suddenly, the center column of Sephiroth, containing Tiphereth (Beauty), Yesod (Foundation), and Malkuth (Kingdom), shifts downward, away from Kether (Crown). This action does two things:

- I. Leaves an open space where Tiphereth was. That made room for placeholder called Da'ath (Knowledge).
- 2. Relocates the platform on which Humankind stands, Malkuth, from Olam ha Yetzirah (World of Formation) to Olam ha Asiyah (World of Action).

This is a Kabbalistic way of charting the separation of God from mankind, the introduction of evil into the world, and why life can be so hard. The upside is that we live in a world of action, where we can do something about the things that bother us.



Stage 4: The center column shifts downward, relocating Malkuth into the World of Action.

What Happened in the Garden?

The Garden of Eden story is found in the first three chapters of the Book of Genesis. The story is packed with so much symbology and etiology that you would have to write a book to explain it all. Countless authors have done just that

For the purposes of this article, we will cut to the part where God tells Adam not to eat the fruit of the "Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil" or TKGE. A crafty talking snake shows up and convinces Eve to eat it anyway, and she

gave some to Adam, which he ate. When God comes down for a visit, Adam and Eve are upset and afraid. God knows why but still gives them a chance to explain themselves. Adam blames Eve, and Eve blames the snake. Each of the three receives a specific set of consequences. Adam and Eve end up being kicked out of the garden of Eden.

In Jewish tradition, eating the fruit of the TKGE represents the beginning of the mixture of good and evil together. Before that time, evil existed as an entity separate from the human psyche, and it was not in human nature to desire it. Eating and internalizing the forbidden fruit changed this, and thus was born the "yetzer ha ra", the evil inclination. It competes against the "yetzer ha tov", the good inclination. As humans, we each have these urges and regularly choose between them. Our choices determine our spiritual development and what kind of people we become.

In Christian tradition, consuming the fruit of the TKGE was the original sin committed by Adam and Eve that led to the fall of man as described in Genesis 3. The early Christian theologian and philosopher Augustine of Hippo emphasized that the fruits of that tree were not evil by themselves, because everything that God created was good. Rather it was Adam and Eve's willful disobedience of God that caused disorder in the creation. All of humanity is said to have inherited sin and guilt from Adam and Eve's sin.

In Muslim tradition, when God created Adam and Eve, he told them that they could enjoy everything in the Garden except for one particular tree, without naming it. Satan appeared to Adam and Eve, telling them the only reason God forbade them to eat from the tree was that they would become angels or immortal. When they ate from this tree, their sin is referred to as a "slip". They repented to God and asked for his forgiveness, and were forgiven.

So among the Abrahamic faiths, only the Christian has a concept of Original Sin and the Fall of Mankind. But in all three faiths, we find an answer to the question of why evil and difficulty exist in the world.

Insights from the Kabbalah

Back to the Adam and Eve story. They were ejected from the garden paradise into the world as we know it. In that process, they accomplished two things:

I. Gained the Knowledge they sought, as represented by Da'ath (Knowledge) filling the empty space in the Sephiroth tree.

From the Venerable Master Continued

Let us look at the two parts separately. The square as a tool of operative masons was used to test the accuracy of the sides of a stone; to prove that they were squares with regard to the other sides, and that all angles were identical. It thus acted as a standard from which the stones were judged as being fit or otherwise for the building.

The square has two meanings - the angle of 90°, the fourth part of a circle, and the two-armed implement containing an angle of 90°. It has been used symbolically for a long time. To the Chinese in 2500 BC "square" meant honest and straightforward. By the 4th Century BC Mencius taught that all men must apply the square figuratively to their lives if they would walk in the straight paths of wisdom and keep within the bounds of honour and virtue.

Note, too, that nowhere in nature is a perfect square to be found. It must be made by man working with materials - wood, stone, metals - provided by nature. From this we infer that man must work with the GAOTU to secure the bounty He bestows upon His creatures.

In Masonry the square is a symbol of morality and is presented as one of the Great Lights, a Working Tool, and the emblem of the WM. It inculcates the principle of morality, honesty and truthfulness, and points out our duty to our neighbour, to all Mankind, to the Craft.

The compasses were used by operative masons to mark out the ground from the scaled plans of the intended structure. This instrument, working with one point in the centre, describes the circumference of a circle, thus limiting an area to the part enclosed. In the same way the compasses remind us that in His unerring and impartial justice, God has defined the limits of good and evil, and that we shall be rewarded or punished according to the way we have kept within this circumference or gone beyond it.

The symbolism of the compasses thus supplements the inner light we obtain from the Volume of the Sacred Law (VSL) by pointing out the duty we owe to ourselves - the duty of keeping our desires within due bounds, and of circumscribing our passions and prejudices. Without this voluntary restriction, this practice of self-discipline, we cannot be fully free.

The square and compasses, then, refer to a Mason's duty to the Craft and to himself, a symbol of Brotherhood appropriate to the ideals of Masonry. This combination is very old, too, as the Chinese for many years BC used the square and compasses to suggest order, regularity, and propriety.

The position of the square and compasses on the VSL has special significance now, connected with the progress of the candidate through the degrees. However, during the 18th Centu-

ry the points of the compasses and the ends of the arms of the square were directed away from the Master toward the candidate to indicate that he was included in the body of Freemasonry.

From the symbolism of the square and compasses we can learn the way to live. The standard of life, or the standard of living, cannot be measured in terms of material things like cars, TV sets and other technical devices, excellent though they are. They are merely aids to living. The real standard is measured in terms of intangible factors; obligation to the family and friends, widening to concern for our neighbours, to the acceptance of responsibility toward the weak - welfare of the community in place of gain for self. This is what we understand by morality, and this is what we practise when we act upon the square.

As Joseph Fort Newton says,

A society without standards will be a society without stability and it will one day go down. Not only nations but also whole civilisations have perished in the past for lack of righteousness. Hence the importance attached to the square of virtue, and the reasons why Masons call it the symbol of their Craft. It is the symbol of that moral law upon which life must be based if it is to continue.

So, we as Masons know that the square and compasses are not just abstract symbols, but through their symbolism they show us that every day, no matter with whom we are or where we are, we should "Square our actions and keep them within due bounds".


Annual Dinner Ticket Books

And finally we got some good news in that Amazon wants to extend their contract for at least another year, this is great news as we can fund our budget without taking as much from our investments as originally planed. So 2023 is looking to be another good year for the Foundation.
