A rhan is an affectionate five year-old boy who was screened at our clinic and put on our wait list in October of 2013. He was two and-a-half at the time and had difficulty producing two-word utterances and many sounds. Arhan began treatment at our clinic exactly a year later. He was then scheduled and seen for two forty-five minute speech therapy sessions each week for eighteen months.

He accomplished so much in that time!! For the eighteen months he worked on turning on his voice on for his /h/ sound at the beginning of words, rounding his lips for the "sh" sound at the beginning of words and producing three syllable words which included the /v/ sound in the medial word position. The last three months that he attended this clinic he was working on following three-step directions, producing four-word utterances, producing present progressive verbs when picture describing, and answering where questions. His emotional regula-



tion was also monitored during his speech sessions. Arhan loved playing with cars as a break in the middle of his sessions or for the last five minutes of his sessions.

Arhan's parents were referred to our clinic through his pediatrician. Here is what they had to say about the time they spent here.

"Our experience at the Scottish Rite Childhood Clinic was great! Our son loved to go to his sessions. He loves Ms. Jenna. We started attending this clinic when Arhan was three and-a -half years old. Prior to that, he only had a few words and had a hard time expressing himself. We also felt that he understood little. He would get frustrated and throw tantrums. He made tremendous progress! He can talks in sentences and explains his needs now! These eighteen months of service have made a huge difference! There are a lot less tantrums and whining. It is so rewarding to see that the tantrums have reduced! Also, he is doing well with directions as he can understand a lot more. The most rewarding part about receiving speech therapy at the Scottish Rite Clinic is seeing Arhan make progress and express his thoughts. Also, he made tremendous progress from producing a few words, to making intelligible sentences. Ms. Jenna worked particularly on articulation which helped him converse with others. Ms. Jenna is so nice, warm and listened to all our concerns. Arhan has made such great progress in these last eighteen months that we couldn't have imagined! Thank you Scottish Rite Clinic! "

Arhan worked so hard the entire time he was here! His joy, smiles and hugs will truly be missed. Best of luck to you and your family Arhan! Hope to see at the Christmas party at the end of the year!!



I hope your summer is off to a good start. The weather has been great and gas prices are still kinda low. As long as you don't watch the news, everything is fantastic. Therefore, I am pleased to announce the Consistory will be hosting a luncheon at <u>Taurinus Brazilian Steakhouse at</u> 1:00 PM on Sunday, August 21st.

Taurinos is a restaurant referred to as a *churrascaria*. A churrascaria is a place where meat is cooked *churrasco style*, which translates roughly from the Portuguese word for 'barbecue'. To understand the gaucho idea behind a churrascaria restaurant, you must first understand the gaucho way of life in the early 1800s.



When European immigrants settled in Argentina, Uruguay, and southern Brazil, cattle raising was the primary way of life. Gauchos (cowboys) were the men who worked with the cattle. They had amazing horse-wrangling skills and a great appreciation for the land. They were nomads, following the cattle and the work.

Because the gauchos had no way to preserve food, after butchering a cow, they would skewer and cook large portions of meat immediately over a fire. The meat was slow-cooked, basting in its own juices, creating tender, flavorful steaks.

The tradition is carried still today at restaurants like Taurinus. So, if this sounds tasty, and you are interested in attending, please RSVP to me by our August stated meeting. The price will be \$36.00 per person, including tip. This will cover all the meats, sides, and ice water you can stomach. There is a full bar but drinks are extra. Hope to see you there!

The Mulla (Master) Nasrudin is a classical figure devised by the dervishes partly for the purpose of halting for a moment situations in which certain states of mind are made clear. He appears in thousands of stories - sometimes witty, sometimes wise - but often, too, as a fool or the butt of a joke. A Nasrudin story usually has a subtle humor and pedagogic nature.
