




Joshua is a sweet and energetic 4 year old boy who comes to our clinic twice a week for speech and language therapy. He was referred to our clinic by his school district as he had a limited vocabulary, was hard to understand, and experienced frustration as he was not able to be understood.

When Joshua began treatment at this clinic it was difficult for him to produce a variety of sounds and three syllable words. He left off many sounds in clusters, such as producing "top" for "stop." In addition, he struggled to answer "what" and "which" questions. Joshua is now able to produce most three syllable words and cluster sounds in short phrases. He continues to need support with expanding his vocabulary and producing /l/ in phrases.



Clinic Director's Message November 2012

During the month of September, we completed 198 treatment hours. A total of 49 children received speech and language services. Two (2) children were discharged from our services and three (3) children were added to the caseload.

There are currently 107 children on our waiting list. We did not conduct any screenings during September because we had agreed to close our waiting list temporarily at the August 2012 Foundation Board meeting. However, we continue to receive, on average, five calls or emails per week from families interested in our speech and language services. We are asking them to contact us again in January 2013.

Our annual Clinic Children's Christmas Party is scheduled for Saturday, December 1 from 11:30 AM - 3 PM. Please make add this event to your calendar and plan to come out and support your Children's Language Clinic. There will be plenty of food, games and entertainment. Plus, Santa Claus is expected to make a special appearance.

In 1939, President Roosevelt ruled that after 1941, the fourth Thursday of Novemberwould be observed as Thanksgiving Day and would be a legal federal holiday.
