



From the Clinic



Penelope is a sweet 10 year old girl who has been seen at the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic for speech and language delays with receptive and expressive language and social communication. When Penelope first started coming to our clinic she was only using single words to communi-

cate. Her mother reported that she used her "own words" that no one could understand. She also had difficulty initiating a conversation, using eye gaze and gestural communication to interact with others, and was unable to ask questions or make comments during the course of a conversation.



Penelope has made exceptional progress toward her speech and language goals. She is now using sentences of up to ten words in length to communicate with a variety of grammatical and syntactical structures. She will take up to six turns during conversation given some support. She is more effectively initiating conversations and using questions and comments spontaneously to share information with her communication partner. She can also follow directions of increasing length and complexity given some assistance. Her mother reported that she has improved immensely with her ability to communicate with her family, friends and at school. Penelope's mom commented that "Everybody is happy. It's easy to communicate with her." We are so proud of Penelope's progress. Her language has blossomed and it is a joy to see her more effectively communicating! Great job Penelope!






FROM THE COMMANDER

(The information found in this article is taken from the Scottish Rite Ritual Monitor and Guide)

The San Jose Council of Kadosh is the Body responsible for the 19th through the 30th Scottish Rite Degrees, known as the "Philosophical and Chivalric Degrees." The information below is a synopsis of the 26th Degree—PRINCE OF MERCY, or SCOTTISH TRINITARIAN."



"I Am the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the Ending, Saith the Lord"

This is the 3rd and Final of the novitiate of the Mysteries Degrees, in which you represent one of the faithful & elect.

The early Christian Mysteries are introduced, and some of their ideas are expounded upon, as were the early Hebrew Mysteries in the Twenty-fourth and the Islamic Mysteries in the Twenty-fifth Degrees. Their grades were Purification, Initiation, and Accomplishment, or Perfection.

The Grip of the Lion's Paw is identified as representing the mental grasp of a new definition of the world, by which Man is raised in consciousness from the dead and putrefied state of mental ignorance. You will again be symbolically lustrated with water as a symbol of purification by suffering and sorrow. You will again share food and wine, remembering that we are fellow travelers on the path, and that we are united in our pursuit of Truth.

reetings Brethren,

I would like to begin by once again congratulating the Valley's latest class on becoming Scottish Rite Masons. To be invested with "the cap" is truly an honor. The Southern Jurisdiction has a lot to offer its members and can be a very rewarding for those who get involved.

Options for involvement are numerous. You can become an officer in one of the four bodies; join the College of Consistory or Scottish Rite Research Society; become a Knight of Saint Andrew; join a degree team; start a degree team; read a book about

Scottish Rite Masonry (Bridge to Light, Scottish Rite Ritual Monitor and Guide, Morals and Dogma, Clausen's Commentaries...) or one of the many figures and related traditions discussed in its Degrees; purchase one of the Mastercraftsman Programs; or simply assist in the planning of the Valley's events. Sound like a lot? It is...but so was 29 degrees in a few days.

It is for this reason that many have referred to the Scottish Rite as University of Masonry. There is a lot to learn beyond the ceremonies of any Degree. In fact, Albert Pike stated that a Scottish Rite Mason has not truly had a Degree until he has read the accompanying chapter in Morals & Dogma. Therefore, I would suggest starting-off by purchasing one of the MasterCraftsman programs. They are available on the Supreme Council's website. These texts and quizzes will better familiarize you with the history, lessons, and philosophies discussed and alluded to in the Degrees. Personally, I found the greatest benefit of these courses was not what I learned about the Scottish Rite, but rather what I learned about myself.

The Scottish Rite, like everything in Masonry, can only be what you make of it. It can be a life-changing experience or a once-a-month supper club. The choice is yours. Membership in the San Jose Valley, as you have probably already noticed, means a lot of different things to a number of different people. What will it mean to you?
