



From the Venerable Master

I thank the Brethren for allowing me to serve you as Venerable Master in 2012. I will do all I can to make the ensuing year a productive, enjoyable and educational experience.

It is my intention throughout the year to use this column as a forum to shine the beam of Masonic light on various ideas and concepts which I trust you will find worthwhile. So, during the year I am going to share some of the thoughts of my two favorite Masonic scholars: Ill Manly P. Hall, 33 Degree and Worshipful Brother Walter Leslie Wilmshurst. I find much of value in their writings as to the practice of our gentle craft. I will cite four books up front that I recommend for your reading. If you have already read them they are worth an encore.

From Ill Hall I commend "The Lost Keys of Masonry" and "Freemasonry of the Ancient Egyptians". From the fertile mind of Brother Wilmshurst I recommend "The Meaning of Masonry" and "The Masonic Initiation".





The true mason is not creed- bound. He knows that within the divine light of his Lodge that as a Mason his religion must be universal; Christ, Buddha or Mohammed makes no difference. The true mason recognizes only the light and not the bearer. He knows the truer understanding of the "oneness" of all spiritual truth.

The true Mason has the power of observation. He is a student of human nature and sees in those around him the unfolding and varied expressions of the connected spiritual Intelligence. He has sworn that in his everyday life he will use the life message he hears and build it as Temple to his God. He is a living instrument or tool in the expert hands of the Master Workman.

To close, I think it is both important and interesting to point out that Ill Hall was 19 when he started writing this book. He was only 21 when it was published and he was not a Mason at that time. It was from his study of comparative religion that he became aware of the secret philosophical schools and societies of the ancient worlds. This knowledge and the many books on Freemasonry that were readily available in the library led him to write "The Lost Keys of Freemasonry".

Mark your calendars for our two evenings of Scottish Rite Instruction and Agape Dinners. The first is on May 29^{th} and the second on November the 20^{th} .


Those who attended our previous Nights of Instruction have enjoyed an evening of Masonic Light, great food, drink and Brotherly Love.

From the Master of Kadosh

Brethren,

My article each month this year will most likely be something about the *Consistory* and hope you will find it interesting. The following is an excerpt from the Scottish Rite Ritual used for the Master Craftsman program.

The Consistory of the Masters of the Royal Secret comprises the Thirty-first and Thirty-second Degrees. The word consistory derives from the Latin consistorium, which means "tribunal" and "imperial council." The aptness of this word will become readily apparent.

As with the other degrees of Freemasonry, the consistorial degrees present some of their lessons by borrowing the symbols of other cultures and times.

In the Thirty-first Degree the mythology of the ancient Egyptians is vividly portrayed, as a tribunal or court of the dead is represented. Within its drama, based upon the Egyptian Book of the Dead, a soul seeks to find favor in the eyes of his judges and receive his eternal reward.

The Thirty-second Degree recapitulates the lessons of the Scottish Rite prior to introducing the candidate to the Royal Secret and the Holy Doctrine. The reality of God's intimacy with mankind is reinforced as a fact and truth, and not merely an idealistic notion. The Master of the Royal Secret learns that by self-sacrifice and the application of philosophical truth he may become part of Freemasonry's ideal of a Holy Empire, an the empire of intellect, reason, philosophy and wise morality.

The Master Craftsman Program contains a tremendous amount of knowledge to be absorbed and is very valuable. There are still copies of the program available from the General Secretary. Get one and get started on further Scottish Rite Light.


From the Clinic!



Liam is a sweet four-year old boy who started services at our clinic because he was delayed with his receptive and expressive language, play, and pragmatics skills. His parents brought him to our clinic because they were concerned about his difficulty in expressing himself and carrying on a conversation with others. Liam's expressive language tended to lack complexity. He also had difficulty with producing bilabial sounds, such as "p" and "b" and frequently drooled.


A treatment program that worked on oral motor exercises to strengthen Liam's lips helped to decrease Liam's drooling and to increase lip closure for production of "p" and "b". In addition, therapy focused on expanding Liam's

play skills, using more complex expressive language, and following directions of increasing length and complexity.

FEBRUARY 2012 Clinic Director's Message

uring the month of December we completed 184 treatment hours. A total of 58 children received speech and language services, including six (6) screenings. Two children were discharged. Currently we have a total of 106 children remaining on the waiting list.

We are proud to announce that 161 children received speech and language services in our clinic during the 2011 year, an increase of 62 children as compared to 2010, in part because we resumed conducting screenings. The total number of treatment hours completed from January through December 2011 was 2,727 hours, including 66 screenings. 46 children were discharged from treatment. We are looking forward to another highly productive year in 2012.

We would like to thank everyone for helping the clinic touch the lives of so many families in our community in 2011.

I tried to stay cheerful. And do you know what? Wonderful things happened. Many young people came to the jail to visit me. They threw flowers and notes up to my window. They wanted me to know that they, too, believed in love.

One of these young people was the daughter of the prison guard. Her father allowed her to visit me in the cell. Sometimes we would sit and talk for hours. She helped me to keep my spirits up. She agreed that I did the right thing by ignoring the Emperor and going ahead with the secret marriages. On the day I was to die, I left my friend a little note thanking her for her friendship and loyalty. I signed it,

"Love from your Valentine."

I believe that note started the custom of exchanging love messages on Valentine's Day. It was written on the day I died, February 14, 269 A.D. Now, every year on this day, people remember. But most importantly, they think about love and friendship. And when they think of Emperor Claudius, they remember how he tried to stand in the way of love, and they laugh -- because they know that love

can't be beaten!
