

From the Master of Kadosh

reetings Brethren,

It has been said that there is no month sweeter than November. I tend to think so, too. This month I get to celebrate my birthday, Thanksgiving, and the end of this reality show we call an election. However, November has always been my favorite month because it is a time of change and transition. The Law of Nature brings into operation cycles of the seasons, and of the ages; and everything we do in our many lifetimes, our lifespans, operates under the same Law of Nature. The cycles of initiation also follow



this same natural pattern, but in addition they have in them a fusion with the higher Law of Redemption, bringing the gifts of the Spirit and enlightenment. Thus the initiatory cycles follow basically the same pattern as natural cycles, but sparkling with jewels of higher consciousness and comprehension. In fact, the myth of the Twelve Labors of Hercules served as an allegory for these initiatory cycles to ancient Greek initiates.

"Hercules, by the will of Jupiter, was subjected to the power of Eurystheus, and obliged to obey him in every demand. He consulted the oracle of Apollo and was told that he must be subservient for twelve years to the will of Eurystheus, in compliance with the commands of Jupiter; and that, after he had achieved the most celebrated labors, he should be translated to the gods."

So he started off upon his career and, as the disciple under command of his soul, undertook the twelve labors, performing each of them in one of the zodiacal signs. He, therefore, represents every disciple who seeks to tread the path and demonstrate his control over the forces of his nature, and he likewise represents the point to which humanity now finds itself.

November is the month of Scorpio and corresponds with the second labor of Hercules—conquering Lernean Hydra. The Hydra was a monstrous serpent with nine heads, one being immortal. The task assigned to Hercules had nine facets. Each head of the hydra represents one of the problems that beset the initiate who seeks to achieve mastery of himself. Three of these heads symbolize the appetites associated with sex, comfort, and money. The second triune group concerns the passions of fear, hatred, and desire for power. The last three heads represent the vices of the unillumined mind: pride, separativeness, and cruelty (remind you of anyone).

The dimensions of the task which Hercules undertook are thus plainly apparent. He had to learn the art of transmuting the energies that so frequently precipitate human beings into catastrophic tragedies. The nine forces which have wrought unspeakable havoc since the beginning of time had to be re-directed and transmuted.


The three qualities of character that Hercules had to express were humility, courage, and discrimination: humility, to see his plight objectively and recognize his shortcomings; courage, to attack the monster that lay coiled at the roots of his nature; and discrimination, to discover a technique for dealing with his mortal enemy.

By the way, last month I decided to turn-over my column, in-full, to a very respected Masonic scholar, Illustrious Brother Albert Mackey. The excerpts were from an article he wrote in 1924 titled, *Reading Masons and Masons Who Do Not Read.* I recommend every brother read it in full. I chose to include it in last month's column because I believe Mackey's blunt assessment of Masonry is more relevant today than what it was in his time. And judging by your responses, many of you agree.
