From the Personal Representative:

Brethren, Ladies and Friends;

Last month I attempted to deliver what I felt was a small answer to some of the criticisms we often hear directed toward Masonry and our culture. This month, I'd like to convey some thoughts on what our Masonic culture means to me.

Reflect, for a moment, if you would, on that word 'culture". What does it mean to you? The dictionary has several parallel definitions for the word, probably best summarized in the Miriam Webster dictionary as: "Enlightenment and excellence of taste acquired by intellectual development and training", or "An acquaintance with and taste in fine humanities, and broad aspects of science as distinguished from vocational and technical skills". Does this sound like some-thing we, in Masonry endeavor to practice and include in our message to the world?

Tuesday evening, November 23, at our Night of Instruction we had a fascinating talk delivered by Brother Adam Kendall, 32°, director and curator of the Masonic Museum at Grand Lodge in San Francisco. The message covered mainly the symbolism of Freemasonry, but in his presentation, Brother Kendall impressed upon us several critical points. He told us that Freemasonry as a source of strength comes from within, but we must be constantly aware and receptive to information from outside ourselves to give a focus and framework for those internal beauties and concepts. That one point really struck a note with me. He was stressing the benefits of study and research in subjects dealing with the craft, but the greater message was a kind of summary of what I feel is one of the great concepts of our 'culture'; that of the necessity to try to inculcate in our lives, a two-way communications system whereby we use our day-to-day experiences to improve our own outlook.

Further, Brother Kendall told us we should demonstrate evidence of our commitment to our culture by presenting ourselves as moral and upright people (I don't want to limit this message just to men, as I know our ladies share these values) to all we encounter as they tend to judge us by the standards we espouse, whether they admire those standards or not.

Brother Kendall's message deserves not only our attention, but also our serious reflection and consideration

In our Masonic lectures we talk about the plumb as teaching us to walk and act uprightly; the square to assume an attitude of virtue; and the level to 'prove horizontals', or in other words, to prove to others that, while we hold our selves in esteem, we recognize the equality of

all, when it comes to personal worth.

Lastly, and this is more of my own interpretation of that message, we should be proud of our culture, our commitment to Freemasonry, and our values, and present ourselves to the world with assurance and dignity. Our culture and values are what made this country what it is today and the world at large owes Masonry a debt of thanks.



Fly your colors with pride and let your friends know that by becoming a Mason you have become a better person.

ongratulations and welcome to the 12 new members of the San Jose Scottish Rite. You are to be commended on your travels through the degrees and orders of Freemasonry. Only through active participation will the lessons taught in the degrees be further experienced. One avenue for active participation is in the San Jose Chapter Knights of Saint Andrew. The KSA meets on the first Monday of the Month at 7:30pm in the Scottish Rite Center. All Scottish Rite Masons are invited to attend. The meeting is under the direction of Chief Knight, Gerald Best. Meetings address, bi-law changes, current events in which we are invited to participate and inducting new members who would like to be of service to the Scottish Rite. Areas of service include, but are not limited to, Cast members for Degrees portrayed in Spring and Fall Reunions; support crews for all degrees; Parades like the Veteran's Day parade and Fourth of July, Greeters for the Scottish Rite Stated Meeting and all other official functions of the Scottish Rite.

Roles for the 29th Degree, Scottish Knight of Saint Andrew, are primarily comprised of members of the Chapter. Chapter officers wear black hackles in reflection of their hat color. The Chief Knight wears a Black and a white hackle as a mark of his office.

The San Jose Knights of Saint Andrew have a presence on "Facebook."

The only requirement for membership is that one be a Scottish Rite 32nd Degree Mason. If you have an interest in service to the Scottish Rite and your community, contact any Sir Knight.

The Director for the 29th Degree is searching for Bagpipe player(s) and drummer(s). Pipers and drummers must be Scottish Rite 32nd Degree Masons and be adept in playing Celtic music to accompany a theatrical performance. money one more time?"

He grew excited and said "Yes, I just know it has to be enough". So I slipped my money in with his and we began to count it. Of course it was plenty for the doll. He softly said, "Thank you Jesus for giving me enough money." Then the boy said "I just asked Jesus to give me enough money to buy this doll so Mama can take it with her to give to my sister." "And he heard my prayer.

"I wanted to ask him for enough to buy my Mama a white rose, but I didn't ask him, but he gave me enough to buy the doll and a rose for my Mama." "She loves white roses so very, very much." In a few minutes the aunt came back and I wheeled my cart away.

I could not keep from thinking about the little boy as I finished my shopping in a totally different spirit than when I had started. And I kept remembering a story I had seen in the newspaper several days earlier about a drunk driver hitting a car and killing a little girl and the Mother was in serious condition. The family was deciding on whether to remove the life support. Now surely this little boy did not belong with that story.

Two days later I read in the paper where the family had disconnected the life support and the young woman had died. I could not forget the little boy and just kept wondering if the two were somehow connected.

Later that day, I could not help myself and I went out and bought some white roses and took them to the funeral home where the young woman was. And there she was holding a lovely white rose, the beautiful doll, and the picture of the little boy in the store. I left there in tears, my life changed forever.

The love that little boy had for his little sister and his mother was overwhelming. And in a split second a drunk driver had ripped the life of that little boy to pieces.

Stephanie is an engaging and

sweet nine year old girl who is being seen once a week for speech and language therapy at the San Jose Scottish Rite Language Clinic. Recently, Stephanie was placed into a group with a similar functioning peer. Both children have benefitted greatly from each other



and it is helping them to practice social skills by being together.

When Stephanie originally came to our clinic, she presented with delayed language development as well as apraxia. Apraxia creates a difficulty with producing, sequencing and coordinating oral movements. Children with apraxia have a difficult time producing and combining sounds to create words. As a result their speech can be difficult to understand, as was the case for Stephanie. Her mother stated, "She had a very small vocabulary and couldn't communicate clearly, even the most trivial things."

As Stephanie's speech sounds improved, language goals were added to help develop her expressive and receptive language skills. Stephanie is bi-lingual and her family speaks both English and Spanish. There are many speech sound and language differences that can naturally occur when English is developing as a second language. The errors and difficulties that Stephanie was experiencing however were present in both languages.

Mild speech sound errors are still present and Stephanie continues to occasionally mix up sounds in multi-syllabic words. She is currently working on category vocabulary, grammar, expressing grammatically correct sentences, and social skill activities.

Since Stephanie's first therapy session her family has noticed a huge improvement in her speech. Her mother stated, "Life at home has improved a lot. Before she came home crying because other kids didn't understand her and now we don't have that problem. It has been so rewarding to see that most people don't even notice she has a problem."

Stephanie has made great progress and continues to work hard. She is eager to please and thrives when reinforced that she is doing well. When asked about her experience at the clinic, Stephanie's mother said, "Magnificent! Everyone has been very professional and I've noticed every child is given a treatment to meet their own needs."

Clinic Director's Message

Our San Jose Scottish Rite Children's Language Disorders Clinic helped 56 children in October, completing over 242 treatment hours including seven screenings. One child was discharged from treatment and three new children were added from the waiting list. I'm sorry to report that we still have 91 children on that list, awaiting our help.

However, I am happy to report that all of the new clinic training materials ordered earlier this fall have been received. The clinicians have already started to use these more advanced methods in working with the children.

We continue to explore avenues in hopes that we will soon be able to increase our clinician staff and help more kids. Your donations are always greatly appreciated and help to reduce the financial burden on the Foundation.

We are always looking for volunteers to do some work to spruce up the clinic. The clinic could also use new set of vertical blinds and another computer. If you are interested in helping with a project and/or donating some needed items, please contact me.




