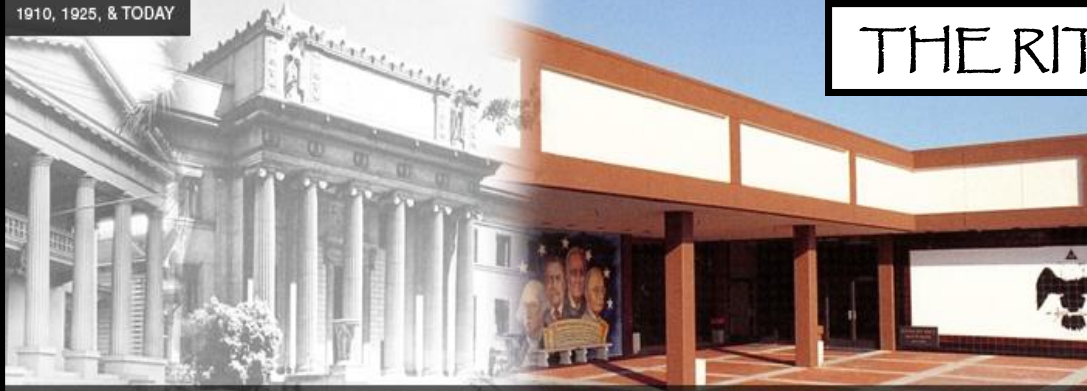

From the Venerable Master

My Brothers,

Our Third Degree lecture starts out: “We read in the holy writings that it was decreed in wisdom and councils of deity aforesaid, that a house should be built, erected to God and dedicated to his holy name.”

We can deduce that all of creation and all of history was decreed before time: (Aleph-Tav). These two letters, in rabbinical circles, represent the beginning and the end. This is related, literally, to the first sentence of Genesis; which we use in our First Degree. There are many other time references in the Third Degree which we can discuss as Masons if you wish.

The councils of Deity is a reference to the book of Amos 3:7. “Surely the Lord God does nothing without revealing his secret to his servants the prophets.” It is very clear that God is the wisdom and the keeper of the plan of all time. Part of that plan starts in 2 Samuel 7: 4-17. This is where the prophet Nathan is instructed to tell David of the house to be built and also of the future; when the house is to be built and by whom.

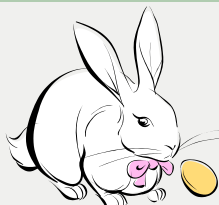

I have often thought that in the ancillary degrees, I find men more interested, passionate or perhaps just have more time in general for Masonry. I enjoy our company and conversations at our Stated Meetings, dinners and degrees. It is interesting that the Scottish Rite it is based by default on Masons of just this type, men interested in acquiring more light. As such, while there are more degrees that either Blue Lodges or York Rite, they are presented in a much more informal format, most of which are communicated rather than conferred, which requires a Scottish Rite Mason to continue to study and learn a bit more than other areas of Masonry. None of this is a surprise to any of you, having participated in meetings, degrees and dinners and done so with a desire to do more in Masonry than just the Three Degrees of their Blue Lodge and the associated housekeeping of Stated Meetings, dinners and community service. I say this not in a disparaging way but to point out what it takes to be a Mason, and what the Masonic experience is to each of us. It is often said that you get out of Masonry what you put into it, which I agree with but at the same time this seems to be a way of saying, that each of us should do more, and that the organization perhaps isn't as organized as it could be. Here in San Jose we are fortunate to have an organization that is growing and changing, one that not only continues the work of the Rite, but is getting better at it each year, better at providing more well-rounded Masonic experience, an unusual circumstance in modern Freemasonry.



For intuitions as old as ours, we have to consider the leveling effects of time and its attraction of the experience to our members. This being said, we are often forced to have one of our primary goals in developing candidates and creating a meaningful experience for them as they are initiated. With that, we hope that these new members, year after year will serve to enforce and reinforce the superstructure of our organizations, contributing to them as they grow, age and change.

This takes the ability to change with the times to remain relevant, to be of interest to these new members. It is an interesting balance in Masonry to keep our heritage and traditions in place with our new members, joining our ranks, learning our craft and hope they are repeating the process in finding and guiding new men to our fraternity. At the same time, while our society changes and what men look for in their increasingly valuable time, is a meaningful experience in the context of their current life. We as members of our valley for example, would never expect to have a meeting in a room lit by candles and heated by stoves as our forefathers did.

It is this balance that I think we can attempt to preserve our past and at the same time embrace the future, finding a place for the old ways to contribute to the new, and the new to light the way for the old.

This is not a new concept. Thomas Jefferson, while not a Mason, he shared many Masonic values and friends. I am sure this helped him keep a keen eye on this in thoughts on civilization and society. On the wall of the Jefferson Memorial you can see the following quote that speaks to this:

I am not an advocate for frequent changes in laws and constitutions. But laws and institutions must go hand in hand with the progress of the human mind. As that becomes more developed, more enlightened, as new discoveries are made, new truths discovered and manners and opinions change, with the change of circumstances, institutions must advance also to keep pace with the times. We might as well require a man to wear still the coat which fitted him when a boy as civilized society to remain ever under the regimen of their barbarous ancestors.

Perhaps some of these old ideas will inspire us in creating the future of our craft.

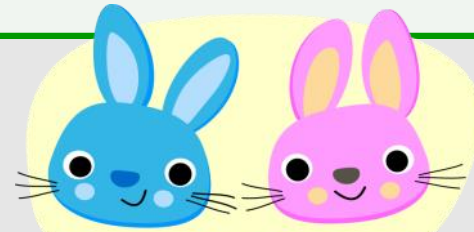

Happy Easter!

There was much confusion among men on and about the soil of California in the latter part of the years 1848 and 1849, however Freemasonry moved among the sick, the dying, and tenderly buried their dead—although there were no Lodges known to be in existence in California at that time. But, Masonic Relief Associations were formed, contributions were freely given, and hospitals were constructed out of

tents and other materials that could be locally procured, and only at great expense.

Cemeteries were hastily located in close proximity to these so called

“canvas cities” and Masonic funeral ceremonies were performed *impromptu*, and the *acacia* was then dropped into the grave—the last fraternal honors and tribute paid to the stranger now dead, by brethren unknown to them when living, and this too—all without a Master of a Lodge or any duly authorized body of Masonry to perform the ceremonies.

It is said that the first Masonic funeral in California took place in San Francisco early in 1849, even before a lodge was opened in that city, and was held over the remains of a brother that was found drowned in the bay of San Francisco. Who he was or from whence he came was never known. His body was covered with Masonic tattoos embracing the all the emblems of Freemasonry and a silver mark of a Royal Arch Mason upon which were engraved the initials of his name. He was buried with Masonic honors in what was known as the “Yerba

Buena Cemetery” since known as the “Sand Lot” in front of San Francisco City Hall.

In the fall of 1849 rumors were afloat in the ‘City’ that sundry persons were in possession of documents purporting to be warrants or dispensations for lodges, but nothing definite could be learned for a time. Colonel Jonathan Drake Stevenson, who had been in commanded of a regiment of New York volunteers during the

war with Mexico, had earlier arrived in California in March of 1847 with his command.

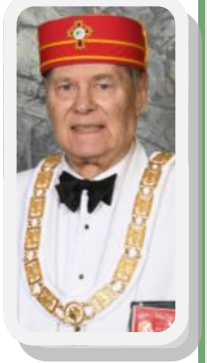
He had just returned from the mines and took up residence in San Francisco and set about examining the credentials of those who claimed to have authority to open lodges. He soon met with the late distinguished Brother Levi Stowell, whom he found in possession of a genuine authority; and after consultation with others of like pure motives, assisted in organizing what is now California Lodge , No. 1, of San Francisco, which held

its first meeting, November 9, 1849.

A charter was issued by the most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the District of Columbia, to open and hold a lodge in San Francisco to be called “California Lodge, No. 13, F. and A. M.” upon its Register. It afterward became No. 1 under the Grand Lodge of California. Subsequent charters were also issued to Western Star Lodge # 98, which became # 2; and to Connecticut Lodge, #75.
