



#### From the Clinic!

Summer is a happy four year old girl who has been attending speech therapy one-twice a week since January of 2013 secondary to receiving a diagnosis of apraxia. She loves to look at books and play with the clinic doll house. She is currently working on producing /g/ in the beginning of words, and /sh/ and /ch/ at the beginning and end of words in sentences. She has made excellent progress in speech therapy! Good job Summer!!



Summer's mother decided to bring her in for speech therapy as Summer, "was struggling developmentally with her speech. She was frustrated not being able to communicate appropriately. She could maybe put 2 word sentence structures together and was having a hard time with articulation. Summer has been in intensive speech therapy for the last 2.5 years. Summer attended two days a week through our school district and now once a week at the Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic."

Her mother noted, "Once we joined The Scottish Rite Clinic, Summer's 1:1 therapy sessions really helped strengthen her articulation issues. Summer would get frustrated easily or want to play by herself due to her lack of communication skills. Over the last year with her Speech-Language Pathologist, Jenna, working 1:1 even 1-2 times a week, Summer's frustration is rarely noticeable. With confidence Summer asks kids to play with her, and she has found the power of words! Summer has blossomed with her speech and articulation over the last year. She is much more confident and happier due to her progression of speech development. She is able to have joyful conversations and make friends at school due to the progress she has made. The most rewarding aspect of receiving services at the Scottish Rite Clinic has been watching the daily changes to Summer's speech patterns and the positive environment that Jenna has provided my daughter in becoming a more confident communicator. Jenna has been the best Speech Pathologist that Summer has met on our journey in speech therapy. Jenna understands Summer so well and has adapted and catered to Summer's personality to tailor her individual sessions to keep Summer engaged and learning. I have referred multiple families to the clinic that I have met along the way. I wish I had known about the program much sooner than I had! Our family is so thankful for the Scottish Rite Clinic. Unfortunately our health insurance was not covering Summer's private speech therapy that we started when she was 2. So for 1.5 years we paid out of pocket for most of her private therapy. Once she was 3 she was enrolled in the school district speech program. However, this program mostly focused on Summer's language development. Summer needed the language development but by the time we qualified for the Scottish Rite Clinic she really needed to work on articulation so she could form clearer words in her sentences and have conversations. The Scottish Rite Clinic has provided our family with the ability to take a deep breath from our medical bills. Our older son has an immunodeficiency which requires a lot of our expenses and we will be forever grateful for the donors to the clinic for giving us this opportunity. Sometimes my husband and I tease each other that soon we may need to send Summer to speech therapy to learn to stop talking! We treasure every word that comes out of her mouth and it's because of Jenna's dedication to helping Summer."



#### A Message From the Commander ...

My Brothers,

It is interesting to know how we are described to the world, by those outside the fraternity. The following is taken from Wikipedia, under the heading "Scottish Rite"

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry (the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction in the <u>United States</u> often omits the *and*, while the English Constitution in the <u>United Kingdom</u> omits the *Scottish*), commonly known as simply the **Scottish Rite**, is one of several <u>Rites of Freemasonry</u>. A Rite is a progressive series of degrees conferred by various Masonic organizations or bodies, each of which operates under the control of its own central authority. In the Scottish Rite the central authority is called a Supreme Council.



The Scottish Rite is one of the appendant bodies of Freemasonry that a Master Mason may join for further exposure to the principles of Freemasonry. In England and some other countries, while the Scottish Rite is not accorded official recognition by the Grand Lodge, there is no prohibition against a Freemason electing to join it. In the United States, however, the Scottish Rite is officially recognized by Grand Lodges as an extension of the degrees of Freemasonry. The Scottish Rite builds upon the ethical teachings and philosophy offered in the craft lodge, or Blue Lodge, through dramatic presentation of the individual degrees.

The thirty-three degrees of the Scottish Rite are conferred by several controlling bodies. The first of these is the Craft Lodge which confers the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason degrees. Craft lodges operate under the authority of <u>Grand Lodges</u>, not the Scottish Rite. Although most lodges throughout the English-speaking world do not confer the Scottish Rite versions of the first three degrees, there are a handful of lodges in <u>New Orleans</u> and in several other major cities that have traditionally conferred the Scottish Rite version of these degrees. The last sentence above is particularly interesting, as those of us traveling to New Orleans this year will have the privilege of attending a Scottish Rite first degree conferred by Germania Lodge.

1. <u>Germania Lodge #46, GL of Louisiana, USA</u> "The Lodge works in the Scottish Rite Symbolic ritual - one of only ten Lodges under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana which work in this historic ritual. The ten Scottish Rite Lodges comprise the 16th District of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana."




