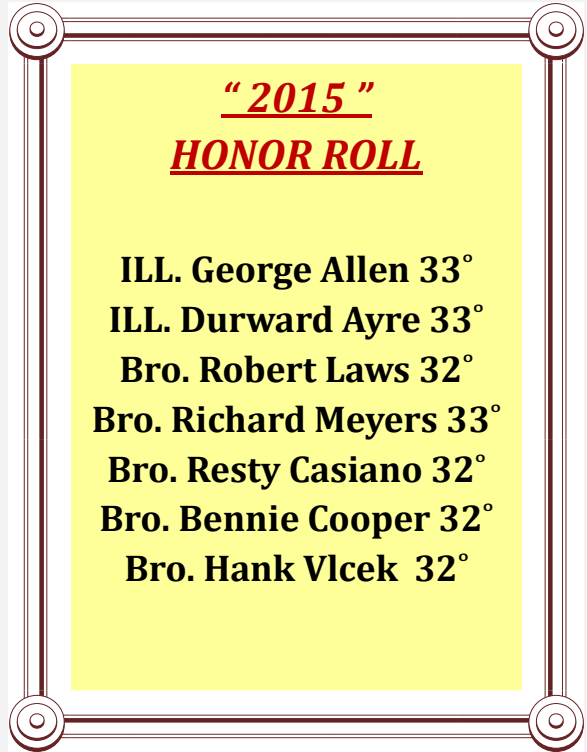

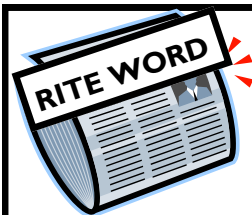

Greetings from your VMAP Committee. VMAP is the Valley Membership Achievement Project. It is a program from the Supreme Council that our Valley is participating in. The object of the Project is to improve the Membership Experience, this includes both current members, candidates going through the degrees, and prospective candidates. You can find information about the program at <http://scottishrite.org/vmap/>

We have a committee in San Jose that is working on implementing the Project. We have sent out questionnaires to our most recent class, to find out how we can improve our Reunion and to see how they would like to get involved in the Valley. We are working to assist in adding degrees to the reunion with the ultimate goal of delivering all 29 degrees. We are working on developing a top line signer program that will include not only rewards for being a top line signer, but also responsibilities to those candidates you are vouching for. We are looking at potential educational opportunities. There are also other activities that we want to help bring to the Valley to improve it for everyone.

The next step in the process is to re-introduce the Lodge Ambassador program. This program was originally developed by Chuck Cowden and put in place a number of years ago, but it eventually died out. The roll of the Ambassador is to be the voice of the Scottish Rite within your blue lodge. It's purpose is absolutely NOT to chicken hawk new Master Masons. The Ambassador will work with the Master to bring in news of happenings in the Valley, invite members and non members to Valley events, be a resource to the lodge with respect to the Scottish Rite, possibly work to invite our Kilted 2nd degree team to deliver a 2nd degree on a candidate at the lodge, get a Scottish Rite Mason to bring in an educational offering to the lodge, or whatever else the Ambassador and the Master decide is appropriate. To that end, we need to identify an Ambassador for each lodge that makes up our Valley. If you are interested, please let either Chuck or me know, otherwise we will be searching out a qualified individual within each lodge.

Stay tuned for more information as we get the program up and running.

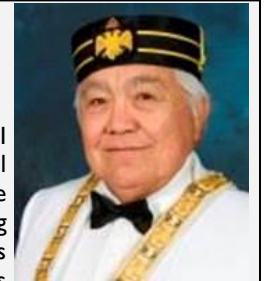

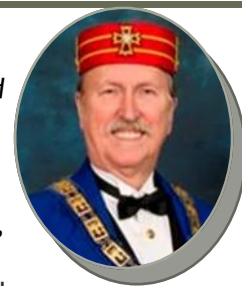

Let Freedom Ring!

Brother George Washington once said, “*The preservation of the sacred fire of liberty and the destiny of the republican model of government are justly considered... deeply, ...finally, staked on the experiment entrusted to the hands of the American people.*” As we know, on July 4, 1776, the thirteen colonies claimed their independence from England, an event which eventually led to the formation of the United States. Each year on July 4th, also known as Independence Day, we celebrate this historic event. So I will remind you that, in the 32nd Degree, you said you would “demand for the people a free voice and vote in public affairs” and that you yourself would be free and remain absolute master of your own voice, vote, and opinion. Let us continue to exercise those freedoms.



For a bit of “July” Masonic history/trivia, on July 1st, 1989 (not that long ago), the Grand Lodge of Hawaii was organized. You could ask MW Leo Mark about that. On July 4th, 1781, Robert Burns received his 1st Degree. On July 19th, 1901, Sir Winston Churchill received his 2nd Degree in Studholme Lodge No. 1591 in London. And, having quoted Brother Washington above, I should mention that on July 29th, 1758, the Grand Lodge of Scotland granted a charter to Fredericksburg Lodge in Virginia, the Lodge that conferred the Masonic degrees on George Washington in 1752 and 1753. Obviously there are other Masonic events of note that have happened in July. Hopefully, you find these I mentioned to be of interest.

Our Scottish Rite Clinics make a difference in this world. As a “prompt” to remind you to generously support our Clinic, I’d like to relate the following story:

A young and successful executive was travelling down a neighborhood street, going a bit too fast in his new Jaguar. He was watching for kids darting out from between parked cars and slowed down when he thought he saw something. As his car passed, no children appeared. He slammed on the brakes and spun the Jag back to the spot from where the rock had been thrown. “Please, mister, please, I’m sorry. I didn’t know what else to do!” pleaded the youngster. “I threw the rock because no one else would stop.” Tears were dripping down the boy’s chin as he pointed around the parked car. “It’s my brother,” he said. “He rolled off the curb and fell out of his wheelchair and I can’t lift him up.” Sobbing, the boy asked the executive, “Would you please help me get him back into his wheelchair? He’s hurt and he’s too heavy for me.”

The driver tried to swallow the rapidly swelling lump in his throat. He lifted the young man back into the wheelchair and took out his handkerchief and wiped the scrapes and cuts, checking to see that everything was going to be okay. “Thank you, sir. And God bless you,” the grateful child said to him.

The man then watched the little boy push his brother to the sidewalk toward their home. He took his time walking back to his Jaguar... a long, slow walk. He never did repair the side door. He kept the dent to remind him not to go through life so fast that someone has to throw a rock at you to get your attention.

From the Clinic



Daniel is a smart, enjoyable seven year old boy who has been seen at our clinic for a moderate articulation disorder since December 2013. Daniel has worked very hard and has been discharged from treatment as he has met all of his speech and language goals!

Originally, Daniel's mom brought him to our clinic because he was difficult to understand. Testing revealed that his articulation skills were moderately delayed as compared to typically developing, age-matched peers. Sounds that were targeted in therapy included "sh", "s"-blends, "l", and "th". In addition, Daniel's receptive and expressive language was tested to determine if there were any delays in language skills. While his overall language abilities were within normal limits, Daniel's articulation errors impacted his expressive grammar skills. This is common in children who have articulation errors. Sometimes we see that the morphological markers such as regular plural "s" or third person singular "s" endings are affected because a child has difficulty producing the "s" or "z" sound at the final position of words. Thus, Daniel not only worked on his sounds in the context of words, but also how these sounds impacted his grammar.

Daniel was such a hard worker. He came to therapy consistently and always practiced his homework. His family's dedication to his speech and language therapy helped Daniel graduate quickly from our program. We are so proud of him! Daniel's mother recently sent a letter of gratitude to our clinic. This letter is a strong reminder of how valuable these services are to the families that we are so honored to help.

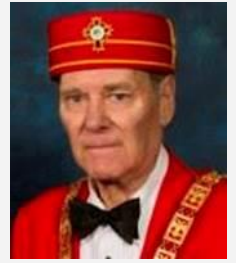
