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


I hope you will join us at our meetings and our other activities. Make San Jose Scottish Rite a regular part of your life. We look forward to seeing you.

# Thirty-second Degree, Master of the Royal Secret, Part I

In the 31st degree, we learned about a final judgement and the reward or penalty an individual might receive based on the choices, intentions, actions, and inactions that happened during his mortal life. In the 32nd degree, we summarize the lessons of the all the previous Scottish Rite degrees and present a philosophy to help each of us, as Scottish Rite Masons, to effectively apply those lessons in our lives.

The organization that provides the 32nd degree is called a Consistory. The presiding officer is called the Master of Kadosh. Recall that Kadosh is a Hebrew term for "Holiness" or something consecrated to a holy purpose.

The degree opens when the Master of Kadosh has the Master of Ceremonies (MC) enter the Consistory with the Aspirant (Candidate). The Prior asks the MC, "Who is this whom you bring before us?" He answers, "It is one who loves wisdom and covets knowledge that he may be a benefactor of men". The Prior asks, "What has he done hitherto toward attaining wisdom, understanding, and knowledge?" The MC explains, "He has ascended from the state of an Apprentice (Ist degree) to that of an Inspector Inquisitor (31st degree)".

The Prior then laments, "Alas! Too many who do so learn little or nothing on the way. Most men value only their material interests or the flattery of exalted titles, and few care to learn the lessons taught by the symbols of Masonry. Some join Masonry out of idle curiosity, some because it may profit them in their business affairs, or secure them aid in distress. Others seek to learn our supposed mysteries or to acquire the titles, decorations, and distinctions Masonry confers. Many are satisfied with Masonic rites or degrees that are but shadows and teach nothing of value. Few care for the great truths of Masonic philosophy or become interested in the study of ancient symbols."

What is the Prior talking about? Who is he talking about? You and me, and the Masonic experience in general. Think about it. When you join Scottish Rite, you receive 29 different degrees. While it may take years to earn a single college degree, you can land a Masonic degree in a couple of hours. Or hear one communicated in 10 minutes. The Prior's last sentence makes his point: "Few care for the great truths of Masonic philosophy or become interested in the study of [our] ancient symbols."

The Prior asks the aspirant, "Do you care for these truths?" The aspirant responds, "Yes". The Prior continues, "If the great questions of philosophy about God, the universe, and yourself are of interest to you, then you are not doing an idle thing in receiving this (the 32nd) Degree..." The Prior explains that the room is dark not in mourning but because the ancient sages are with us, veiled in the shadows. At the vernal equinox, our ancestors gathered before the dawn in the open air, kindled fires, and poured libations upon them, while reciting poems. In the 32nd degree, we hear four voices speaking of "The Supreme Soul, the Light of Lights, Immortal Life, and Preserver of all. He breathes out Wisdom and Power. One is first, it divides into two, and every Spirit comes from this triad of one and two. God is the light that fills all space. The Tree of Life is a symbol of God and man, its three chief emanations are Will, Wisdom, and Understanding".

The Prior comments on how the ancients observed and adored the planets and stars that rose just before the vernal equinox. In them they saw the sacred numbers of 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9, which conceals a great mystery. It has been said that Pythagoras used these symbols, and they have been passed down to us through the Scottish Rite. Their interpretation forms part of the Holy Doctrine and leads toward the Royal Secret.

#### The Scottish Rite Camp

The Prior asks the aspirant, "Do you still wish to know the doctrine and the secret?" The aspirant responds, "Yes". The Prior directs our attention to the Scottish Rite Camp, which now appears on the screen.

Stop at this point and open your copy of "A Bridge to Light" to pages 306 and 307, where there is a large foldout color diagram of the camp. If you think, "Oh, I don't have a copy", recall that you were given a copy when you received your Scottish Rite Degrees. You can refer to the diagram as you continue reading this article.

The Camp is a modern symbol of the mystical numbers of I, 3, 5, 7, and 9. The Prior explains, "If you would have the veil finally removed from between you and the Light, if you would attain the summit of the mountain, up whose slopes you commenced as an (Entered) Apprentice, you must now commence the study of the symbols of this degree". He then asks the Aspirant, "Will this study interest you?" He responds, "Yes". The Prior continues, "It is well. Before you can advance, we must recall for you not only what you have learned and understood but also some of what was hinted in the preceding degrees." He directs the MC to conduct the Aspirant to the Camp.

A different officer, the Master of the Guard, gives the Aspirant dered from the first to the fifth are TENGU. We will a tour of the camp. He begins with the ninth tent, which has a colored flag and two symbolic letters. He notes that Entered Apprentices, Fellowcrafts, and Master Masons are encamped there.

#### The Number Nine

Nine tents are arranged around the nonagon that was shown in the 4th Degree. Each has its distinct flag, symbolic letter, and the Masons of various Scottish Rite degrees camped there. The symbolic letters, ordered from the first tent to the ninth are SALIX NONIS. Those are ten letters, which is why the last camp has two.

#### The Number Seven

The next figure is the heptagon shown in the 14th Degree. There are no camps on the Heptagon. It is there because 7 is one of the symbolic numbers. Among other things, 7 is the number of perfection or completion.

#### The Number Five

The next figure is the pentagon shown in the 18th Degree. There are no tents. And instead of flags there are standards with symbols and Latin mottoes on them. The fifth standard displays the Ark of the Covenant between to palm trees and two lighted torches. Its motto, Laus Deo, means "Praise God". The fourth standard displays an ox. Its motto, Omnia Tempus Alit, means "Time Nourishes Everything". The third standard displays a two-headed eagle wearing a crown and holding a sword and a bloody heart. Its motto, Corde Gladioque Potens, means "Mighty Heart and Sword". The second standard displays a flaming winged heart with a laurel wreath. Its motto, Ardens Gloria Surget, means "Burning Glory Will Rise".

The first standard displays a crouching lion with a key in its mouth. The lion wears a collar with the letters S.Q.S., from the French phrase, "je Suis ce Que je Suis", which means "I am that I am". That brings to mind a Bible passage, Exodus 3:13-15, where

Moses asks God what His name is, and He responds, "I am that I am".

The lion on the standard represents The Lion of the Tribe of Judah. In Genesis 49:9, Israel blesses his son Judah to be a ruler and protector of the Israelite people, and describes him as a lion's whelp. Among Judah's descendents were King David, King Solomon, and Jesus of Nazareth.

Scottish Rite Masons from the 19th through the 30th degrees are camped at these five locations. The symbolic letters, orreturn to the symbolic letters shortly.

#### The Number Three

The next figure is the triangle shown in the 30th Degree. There are no tents, flags, standards or symbolic letters. Appearing by themselves are symbols of a white dove, a black raven, and a golden phoenix. Here are camped the Scottish Rite Masons of the 31st and 32nd degrees.

We do not mention this in the current ritual of the 32nd degree but a third group is said to be camped at the triangle, a Masonic version of the Knights of Malta. When Pope Clement V dissolved the Knights Templar in 1312, he turned over much of their property to the Knights Hospitallers. At the time, the Hospitallers were headquartered on the island of Rhodes. They later relocated to the island of Malta and became known as the Knights of Malta. The French army, led by Napoleon Bonaparte, occupied Malta in 1798 and displaced the Order, which eventually settled near Rome. Known today as the Sovereign Order of Malta, it has no connection with Freemasonry.

#### The Number One

The next figure is a circle, a figure of a single side, added to the Camp in this Degree. There are no tents, flags, standards, symbols, or letters. This is where the 33rd degree Scottish Rite Masons are camped. Within the Circle is a Saint Andrew's cross. A 33rd degree Mason invested as Marshal is camped at each end. And camped at the center of the Cross, is the Sovereign Grand Commander of the Scottish Rite.

The rank of Marshal is equivalent to a five-star General in the United States. Marshals are typically appointed only in wartime. In many countries, especially in Europe, the symbol of a marshal is a baton, and their insignia of rank often incorporate batons. You will recall that in the Blue Lodge, the implement of the Marshal's office is also a baton.

#### The Symbolic Letters

Now let us focus on the symbolic letters. The letters combine to form a phrase SALIX NONIS TENGU. It is said that this phrase contains the initials of a longer French phrase, which when translated to English means, "Let us now offer to the invincible Xerxes our sacred incomparable treasure, and we will succeed

victoriously".

Right away we ask, "Who is the invincible Xerxes?" In the 32nd degree, Xerxes is a code-name for Frederick II, also known as Fredrick the Great, King of Prussia from 1740 to 1786. What made Fredrick so great? His most significant accomplishments include his military successes in the Silesian wars, his re-organization of the Prussian Army, the First Partition of Poland, and his patronage of the arts and the Enlightenment.

Xerxes I or Xerxes the Great (519 to 465 BCE), was best known for his massive invasion of Greece from across the Hellespont (known today as the Dardanelles) in 480 BCE, a campaign marked by the battles of Thermopylae, Salamis, and Plataea. His original Persian name was "Khshayarsha" but we learned of him from the Greeks, who called him Xerxes. They pronounced the name "ZAIR zees" but in English we say "ZERK sees". He may have been chosen to represent Frederick the Great because they were both accomplished military leaders.

More importantly, the traditional authority of the Supreme Council stems from the "Grand Constitutions of 1786". This document is said to have been ratified by Frederick the Great on May I, 1786, just three months before he died. Supposedly, Frederick was the Grand Commander of the order of Prince of the Royal Secret and possessed the sovereign Masonic power over all the Craft. Historically, we know Frederick II was a Freemason, along with the monarchs of many other countries. But there is no record of him holding supreme authority over the Craft.

### **The Vedic Poets**

The Master of Kadosh concludes the discussion of the Camp summarizes the mysterious numbers 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 combined with the (Saint Andrew's) cross, birds, and animals of the Camp and relates them to the Book of Ezekiel and the Apocalypse of John in the Holy Bible. He explains that the Oracles—persons through whom a deity reveals hidden knowledge or a divine purpose—spoke enigmas, which were fatal to those listeners who misunderstood yet acted on them anyway. Sages invent symbols, which the profane misinterpret due to their ignorance, conceit and malice, until the truth becomes folly and the sublime becomes common.

The Preceptor explains that the Psalms in the Bible, before they were written, were recited from memory by the ancient Israelites. In the same way, the ancient inhabitants of the Indus valley, ancestors to both Indians and Europeans, recited their great epic poems, known as the Vedas. The lights of the Consistory grow dim. Several men in long white robes appear, walk around the room, stop at the altar, and extinguish the remaining lights. These represent the Vedic poets. We listen to their words:

"O Triune Agni, eldest yet unborn, shine for us while we wait for the morn; Bearer of our oblations to the sky, bring down the Devas (benevolent supernatural beings) from their homes on high; Scatter your rays in the oppressing night, and fill the dark depths of the woods with light."

"You smile sweetly, Usha fair, the dawn appears like golden hair; Revealing all in girlish grace, your bosom bright, your girlish face; You are the life of all that lives, and joy to every creature gives."

"Fair Mitra, bountiful morning star, come from the unknown realms afar; Over the snowy mountains shine, and with your influence divine; Leaves to the trees long naked bring, with sweet smiles and showers of spring."

The Preceptor explains that the Vedic poets sang their hymns when the constellation Gemini rose just before the sun at the vernal equinox. Twentyfive hundred years before the Christian era, the Pleiades (seven sisters) in the constellation of Taurus (the bull) held that place in the sky and made the bull an object of worship for the Egyptians and Assyrians. Other faiths of that time, from Asia to the British islands, used similar symbolism.

By the Christian era (first century CE) the vernal equinox was in the constellation of Pisces (the fishes) and fish symbolism came to dominate the world's religions. In our time, the vernal equinox is about to enter the constellation of Aquarius, where man is the symbol. And so it is that the world's great faiths do not scorn the trestleboard of the heavens. This ends our discussion of the First Section of the 32nd Degree.

### An Astronomy Lesson

During the Earth's annual revolution around the sun, for one day at noon, the sun is exactly above the equator. Day and night are of equal length, 12 hours each. Around March 21, the sun moves past the equator headed northward, marking the beginning of spring in the northern hemisphere. Around September 23, the sun moves past the equator headed southward, marking the beginning of fall in the northern hemisphere. Leila is a highly motivated and caring 4 year old girl who has progressed through her speech goals in an impressive amount of time! She enjoys working diligently on her articulation drills, read-



ing books, and anything related to arts and crafts. Leila has been receiving speech and language therapy services at the San Jose Scottish Rite Childhood Speech and Language Clinic for four months.

Leila's parents say "Our daughter's speech therapist, Ms. Alisha has done an amazing job improving Leila's speech. Not only does she make our daughter comfortable, she makes the lessons fun and something our daughter looks forward to each week. Her /k/ sounds are so clear now".

We are so pleased to hear that Leila's family sees great progress in her speech development. We look forward to continuing her progress and having fun sessions!

During first century BCE, the Greek astronomer Hipparchus noticed that the positions of the stars in his time differed from where they had been recorded in earlier Babylonian times. He then realized that the Earth was moving and not the stars. In addition to the Earth's daily rotation on its axis, and its annual revolution around the sun, the Earth also has a third motion, a wobble of the Earth's axis that makes a full cycle roughly every 26,000 years. That wobble is called gyroscopic precession.

During the equinox, a specific constellation appears on the horizon just before the sun arose. Because of the Earth's precession, that constellation changes every 2160 years. At the time of the Vedas, Gemini (the twins) appeared just before sunrise at the spring equinox. In those days there was not a pair but a multiplicity of gods, including Agni, Usha, and Mitra from the poems.

From approximately 4420 to 2260 BCE, Taurus (the bull) was the constellation appearing just before sunrise. Bull worshiping cults began to form in Assyria, Egypt, and Crete. This period was also known as the Age of Taurus.

From approximately 2260 to 100 BCE, Aries (the ram) was the constellation appearing just before sunrise. The ram replaced the bull among religious cults. In Genesis 22:1-14, we read that Abraham was about to sacrifice his son Isaac, then God provided a ram as a substitute. This period was also known as the Age of Aries.

From approximately 100 BCE to 2060 CE, Pisces (the fish) is the constellation appearing just before sunrise. This age saw the advance of monotheistic faiths and the fish as a prominent emblem. Jesus of Nazareth told his first disciples that he would make them "fishers of men". See Matthew 14:18-19. The letters of the Greek word for fish, <code>IXΘYΣ</code>, came to stand for <code>Iησοῦς Χρῖστός Θεοῦ Yiός Σωτήρ</code>, meaning "Jesus the Anointed of God Son Savior. This period is also known as the Age of Pisces.

Somewhere around the year 2060, Aquarius (a man pouring water) will be the constellation appearing just before sunrise at the spring equinox. This period is also known as the Age of Aquarius, which many astrologers envision as a time when humanity Page 10

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# **Future Scottish Rite and Masonic Events**
