#### From the Personal Representative:

SANTA CLARA VALLEY

The Council of Masters Meeting on Saturday, Sept. 8, while only lightly attended was certainly the center of some lively discussion and produced some positive results. It was gratifying to see the top officers of all four bodies in attendance, as we had some vital issues on the agenda.

Some of us have felt for many years that our officers' lines have been too long and that there are certain positions that have existed in name only without identifiable duties. With the approval of the Orient under which we operate, it was decided that we will effect a reduction of officers in the four bodies to five officers each. This would include the three principal officers, the Master of Ceremonies, and the Captain of the Guard, who would work with the Tiler for the security of the doors. In some of the bodies this could be accomplished by a gradual work-down of the numbers, but possibly in others, it could be effective with our next year's slate of officers. The so-called Expert positions would be eliminated, as would some of the other positions whose duties are so vague as to be virtually indistinguishable.

The main difference will be that the Prelate position would be moved to the general staff, similar to the Orator and Almoner, and be responsible for the opening and closing prayers at Stated Meetings and other official events.

Another issue that we settled was the matter of regular attendance by the officers. Somehow, over the years, the perception seems to have developed that when a member accepts a position in the line of officers he isn't really expected to attend our meetings until such time as he becomes one of the top officers of his particular body. Our brothers should realize and recognize that when they agree to an appointment to a position in one of the lines that they are accepting a position of leadership. This en-

tails an expectation that they are to attend and participate in not only the stated meetings, but also the reunions and administrative (Council of Masters) meetings. Excused absences are understandable, and we don't intend to be inflexible in imposing impossible demands on a brother's time or his commitment to his family, his work, or his service to God or his country, but we try, through our officers, to operate the Valley in

spirit of accord with the membership, and the input of all our officers is vital to our success.

We understand the sometimes priorities change, and that occasionally unanticipated obligations arise after a brother has accepted an appointment to the officers' corps. When this happens, it is OK to just step away and allow one's successor to fill his position. To do this is probably better that living with the embarrassment of not being available to attend meetings and perform one's duties. As I noted above, the officers' lines will soon be reduced so that everyone who is an officer will have identifiable duties, and no one will feel like just a cog in the wheel. The Senior Wardens of the four bodies will be polling their members to see who will be interested in continuing through the chairs, and we may even move certain members in the lower ranges of the lines so that they will be able to fill other vacancies.

At our next Council of Masters, Saturday, October 4, we should have our next year's slate tentatively established. If there is any, ANY interest in helping out with next years work, please get in touch with me or one of the brothers in our Senior Wardens' positions and express your desires. I'm sure we can reach an accommodation.

Take Time To Pray ... it is the greatest power on earth.





## From the Clinic!!!



Savannah is a sweet 4-year-old girl who started treatment at the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic nearly one year ago. Her mother brought her to the clinic because a developmental pediatrician suspected that Savannah had Childhood Apraxia of Speech. This diagnosis was confirmed when she came to our clinic. Savannah dropped middle and ending sounds in words and had limited consonants and vowels. Her error patterns were not consistent and she demonstrated difficulty with sequencing sounds together to form longer words. Savannah's speech was very difficult to understand. She had good language comprehension, but she was shy because she couldn't express herself. She also became easily frustrated if she wasn't understood or if people asked her to repeat what she said.

During the past year Savannah has worked on including the middle and ending sounds of words, increasing the variety of consonants and vowels she uses, and producing multisyllabic words. She also works on grammar in sentences, which is often difficult for children with apraxia. Savannah's mother has noticed a tremendous im-

provement, "Everyone who knows her says they can understand her. She tries to say everything and is not as frustrated if you ask her to repeat it. She's also not as shy." Her mother boasted that Savannah has really blossomed and has more self-confidence. Savannah continues to make significant gains in therapy, which is in part due to her family's dedication to her treatment. Savannah is a pleasure to work with. She has a vibrant personality, loves to laugh, and always works hard. It's not unusual for her mother to make a comment about the laughter coming from the treatment room after a session.

When asked about her experience at the clinic, Savannah's mother commented, "My experience at the clinic has been great... Savannah loves to come see Ms. Rachel. I would tell other parents about the clinic and I have. The clinic has helped Savannah considerably. We are all so grateful for Ms. Rachel. Like I mentioned before Savannah loves to come to speech..."

Our clinicians currently are treating 35 children but we have another 72 on our waiting list!

- 8. Be tolerant and defend the right to be different. Never use the faculty of judgment to blame or condemn anyone, for you cannot read the hearts and souls of others. Look at them benevolently and leniently, and see what is best in them.
- 9. Be generous towards those who are in need or less favored than you. Arrange things every day so that you do at least one good deed for someone else. Whatever your good deed, do not boast, but thank God for enabling you to contribute to the well-being of others.
- 10. Be moderate in your behavior and avoid extremes in all things. Be temperate, and follow the middle way in all circumstances.
- 11. If you hold a position of power, do not be overly proud about it and do not become intoxicated by the power you may wield. Never use your position to force others to do anything that they disapprove of or that is unfair, illegal, or immoral. Hold your office with humility and make it serve the common good.
- 12. Be attuned to others and speak with care. If you ever criticize, make sure that it is done constructively. If someone asks you for advice on a subject you do not know well, humbly admit your ignorance. Never stoop to telling lies, backbiting, or slander. If you hear malicious gossip about someone, do not support it by lending a willing ear.
- 13. Respect the laws of your country and endeavor to be a good citizen. Always remember, the key to human progress lies in the evolution of consciousnesses.
- 14. Be compassionate. Regard all humanity as your family. Beyond race, culture, and belief, all human beings are brothers and sisters. Consequently, they all deserve the same respect and consideration.
- 15. Consider Nature as being the most beautiful sanctuary and expression of Divine Perfection on earth. Respect life in all its forms, and look upon animals as conscious and sensitive beings—and not as mere living things.
- 16. Be and remain a free thinker. Think for yourself and not according to what other people think. Likewise, let everyone think freely; do not impose your ideas on others and always remember that others are also evolving.
- 17. Respect all religious or philosophical beliefs, as long as they do not strike a blow at human dignity. Do not support fanaticism or fundamentalism in any shape or form. As you live your faith, make sure that you are neither dogmatic nor sectarian.
- 18. Be faithful to your promises and commitments. When you give your word of honor, consider it to be a sacred pledge that


## Make your reservations now for this important event on October 14.

binds you. If you must take an oath, think of the Rose Cross, the symbol of your ethical ideal, while doing so, and remember that any lie you might tell will have karmic consequences for you. Although it is possible to deceive others, no one can escape Divine Justice.

- 19. If you can afford and wish to do so, support the Order materially, so as to promote its activities and contribute to its strength.
- 20. The purpose of the Order is to contribute to the raising of consciousnesses, and the transmission of its centuries-old teachings. Therefore, make yourself available to present its ideals and philosophy to those who seek Knowledge, but without ever trying to coerce them.
- 21. Never cause anyone to believe that members of the Order are sages who are in full possession of the Truth. To those who may ask, present yourself as a philosophical person who is seeking Wisdom. Never pretend you are a Rose-Croix, but say you are a perfecting Rosicrucian.
- 22. In the evening, just before going to sleep, draw up a balance sheet of the day's activities and consider whether the day was constructive or not. Carefully consider what you have thought, said, and done throughout this day. From this review, draw useful lessons for your spiritual evolution, and make firm resolutions.
