


From the Venerable Master



We can do better in 2014



William has been seen once a week at our clinic to receive help for an articulation disorder. He is a sweet and charismatic, nearly ten year old boy. His family has been active with the Masonic Order for many years. They served in the youth organizations of DeMolay and Job's Daughters, where they learned about the services offered at the San Jose Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic.



William began his journey with speech and language therapy before age 3, when he was seen for early intervention services. At this time he was diagnosed with childhood apraxia of speech. Apraxia is a disorder that creates a difficulty producing, sequencing and coordinating oral movements needed to produce speech sounds. Children with apraxia have a difficult time producing and combining sounds to create words. As a result their speech

speech sounds. Children with apraxia have a difficult time producing and combining sounds to create words. As a result their speech can be difficult to understand. Prior to services at the clinic, William's mother stated, "Our son was only understood by immediate family. Most other children and people he interacted with had a hard time understanding what he tried to tell them."

After early intervention and speech and language therapy in preschool and elementary, William began receiving services at our clinic. By that time, William's goals were focused on the /r/ and /th/ sounds. In particular, /r/ can be a difficult sound for children to master and it occurs very frequently in conversational speech.

As treatment has progressed, William has made great progress. His mother reported," Since continuing treatment and with continuous practice, our son's speech has improved to where he is understood 80%-90% of the time. The frequent frustration he had when not understood has dwindled to the point where his interactions are very seldom inhibited by a speech or communication breakdown."

When asked about the family's experience at the clinic, William's mother stated, "Working with the wonderful and patient staff has been a comforting assistance over a hurdle in our son's life. Our overall experience has been positive and reinforcing for our son's ability to continue to strive toward his speech goals. We tell other parents about the services here in order to share the possibilities of aid. Sharing information about the Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic affords children with speech and language needs the access to care providers that they may not otherwise be able to afford."



A Message From The Wise Master

By the time you read this, my first article for the Rite Word, we will all have enjoyed a wonderful installation and reception of the new 2014 Officers Team. Our work started several weeks ago, setting the foundation for this year's program for the Valley. We are looking into a good mix of social, formal, casual, entertaining and educational events, hopefully, something for everyone.

For the Chapter Rose Croix, we are looking into organizing a wine tasting tour, potentially even a few of them. We realize that the calendars are already pretty well booked, between our own programs and those of the other appending bodies, and one single event is not likely to work for everyone. But, wine tastings are always popular, and what we're planning is special! We think that many of you will want to join us!

For those familiar with the Santa Cruz Mountains wineries, it is no secret that in this region, one of the oldest but lesser known, we have 50 to 60 wineries, many of them open only a few times a year, on the so called Passport day. On those days, the third Saturday of April, July, November and January, wine cellars are opened for tours, barrel samples tasted, and often some snacks served and music played. All you need is a one time only purchase of the "Passport", a \$45 little book that entitles you to visit the participating wineries. Passports can be ordered online at www.scmwa.com, or purchased at participating wineries - while their supplies last! So - I strongly suggest you order your "Passport" online NOW to prepare for the tasting tour.

The first trip, Saturday April 19, will get us to one of the most stunning views over the whole valley, at Ridge Winery on Montebello Road. Ridge is one of the California wineries that outperformed the big and famous French wineries, such as Chateau Mouton-Rothschild, Haut-Brion and others, so this will be a treat. They are also famous for their Zinfandels. From there we will visit two more wineries - Naumann, a small family winery, and Cooper Garrot. I will have a sign-up sheet so that I can contact you with directions via email, or cellphone if needed and reception is available. Since this is a casual event, in the early afternoon, there will not be a formal lunch or dinner. I recommend bringing a light snack, maybe to share, and water, but we will not be able to reserve tables on Passport Day. Based on feedback, we may do a more formal tasting some time in the summer timeframe, and could even organize a winery production tour at one of the larger wineries. All those interested, please let me know.

I am looking forward to this year as your Wise Master, and would like to thank the Officers in my line for continuing their service to the San José Scottish Rite for this New Year.



Husband replies, "I can't believe that! Show me."


So she fetched the Bible, and opened the New Testament and showed him at the top of several pages, that it indeed says,
