

From the Venerable Master

Brethren,

This month we will once again consider Ill. Brother Manly P. Hall's attributes of a true Mason which we began to explore in my February message.

A true mason keeps his vow/s. He must realize that failure to live mentally, spiritually and morally up to one's highest ideals constitutes the greatest of all broken promises.

A true Mason knows that his work is not secret but realizes that it must remain unknown to all who do not live the true Masonic life. Yet, if all the so-called secrets of Freemasonry are shouted from the rooftops or broadcast on the Internet, the Fraternity is absolutely safe. These disclosures reveal merely the outward forms and ceremonies of Freemasonry.

A true mason is not proud of position. He is not "puffed up" by his honor, but with a seeking heart is eternally ashamed of his own place, realizing that it is far below the standard of his craft. A true Mason never feels worthy of his Craft.

A true Mason cannot be ordained or elected by ballot. He is evolved through the years of self-purification and spiritual change. There are thousands of Masons who are brethren in name only, for their failure to follow the ideals of their Craft makes them unresponsive to the teachings and purpose of Freemasonry.

The true Mason knows the value of seeking the truth wherever he can find it. The Masonic Lodge is universal; therefore all true Masons will seek through the "extremities of creation for their light". He must search for the high things in lowly places and find the lowly things in high places.

The true Mason realizes charity to be one of the greatest acts of Freemasonry. This means not only properly regulated charity that the Craft pursues but also the charity in his thoughts and actions. Each labor with his own tools and as a Master Mason does not spend his time in criticizing but rather in helping others to improve their tools.

I trust that these thoughts about the qualifications of a true Mason have given you some things to think about and contemplate. You might not agree with everything on this subject as set forth by Brother Hall but I believe there are some measures of merit in his words that we can all use to our benefit.





Continuing my articles in Masonic Education in Scottish Rite, I would like to share this article and its excitement as it relates to our upcoming reunion. It was published in "London Freemason's Quarterly Magazine" sometime around 1868 which I hope you will enjoy it as much as I did.

"If it be asked, for what good are the Superior degrees cultivated? We might answer, that as to personal benefits, the opportunity to 'do good and communicate', to practice all the Masonic virtues, as well as enjoy all the pleasures of fellowship and sociality – so far as these are considered within the sphere of the Masonic acquirements of any brother, the original working degrees of the Ancient Craft Masonry will for him suffice. Only to one who wishes to attain a more extensive knowledge of, and become fully accomplished in, the religious, philosophic, and chivalric departments of our Order, as they were cultivated in the different ages of the world gone by, as well as at the present day, would we recommend initiation in the high degrees. He only will be competent to appreciate the honors and privileges attached to them, who possesses the disposition and ability to study the deeper and higher mysteries of our Kabala, and will not rest satisfied until he has discovered a satisfactory solution to every Masonic problem, and can, in every case, explain 'de que fabulum narratur;' who can thoroughly understand the moral mysteries, as well as those of art and science, which our legends unfold, and who has a laudable ambition to participate in the most exalted sphere, with congenial associates, in that subtle communion and fraternization which genuine 'Sublime Freemasonry' is peculiarly calculated to afford."



Theresa is a sweet, hardworking 12 year old girl who has been coming to the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic due to a speech and language disorder. Like her older brother and sister who also have articulation issues, Theresa struggled with producing her r's, l's and th's. She dropped syllables of multisyllabic words and the final consonants of words. She also had some difficulty with oral motor skills, such as movement of the tongue independently of the jaw. In addition, she struggled with grammar, such as regular past tense.

Theresa's steadfast work during the past year has paid off and her family has noted significant improvements since she enrolled in treatment. Her mother reported that her speech is "more intelligible". Her family has also noticed that they don't have to ask her to repeat herself as much. Most importantly, her parents have noticed that Theresa is more confident!

Theresa has mastered producing multisyllabic words and adding final consonants to words during conversation. She has also graduated from working on her l's. She continues to work toward mastering her r's, th's and grammar.

Theresa's family has found their experience at the clinic "very positive". Her parents also commented that the "staff is professional and friendly and deliver results." Theresa's family has been instrumental in her progress. She always completes her speech homework and works hard during her speech sessions. Theresa is always a pleasure to see in the clinic!



<u>APRIL 2012</u> <u>Clinic Director's Message</u>

Fifty-six (56) children received speech and language services in February for a total of 244 treatment hours completed. One child began to receive our services, two children were discharged and we completed five screenings. We presently have 110 children remaining on the waiting list.

Jenna picked up some cases from Sharon Lewis, who left on maternity leave. Sharon did an excellent job of taking care of our children and will be missed.
