The Rite Word

From the Venerable

In this brief discourse allotted to us, we will endeavour to trace and analyze the application of

uncommon words and phrases used in Masonry. The meaning, spelling, pronunciation and

application of some of these words have varied considerably in the past and even up to the

present. Some of the pronunciations and spellings are now obsolete except for their usage in Masonic phraseology.

My research and interpretations are not to be taken as the final word in defining these words and phrases; no doubt many of you can add further light by your own knowledge and interpretations. However, it is my hope to stimulate your curiosity and encourage your further study and research, which after all is what Masonry is all about.

There still seems to be confusion in the minds of some members of the Craft, concerning the meaning of the terms, "Right Worshipful", "Most Worshipful", and "Worshipful" as applied to a brother holding certain offices. They seem to think it has a literal meaning associated with the duties of worship, a kind of religious implication. Such, however, is not the case and in fact, judging by the minutes, it was not until 1730, that the terms "Right Worshipful" or "Worshipful" appear. Till then it was "Brother" and the first Grand Master was described as Brother Sayer.

What is a Lewis? - A son of a Freemason. What does that denote? - "Strength".

Some authorities have claimed that to be entitled to the term, the son must be born after his father has been made a Mason; others take a wider view and grant the designation to a son whose father becomes a Mason after the child's birth.

<u>The Word Tubal Cain</u>, means "worldly possessions or possessor of the world", or "one who is jealous of confusion". Tubal Cain was the son of Lamech and Zillah, brother of Jabel and Jubel, and the first worker in metals. He is mentioned in the bible, in the Book of Genesis, Chapter 4, Verse 22. (An instructor of every artificer in brass and iron.)

<u>Hiram Abiff:</u> - a widow's son - name meant Master Workman, Architect and Chief Builder. (He was a Smith and not a stone Mason.)

Hiram, the widow's son, was the son of a Tyrian, his mother being an Israelite of the tribe of Dan, and the widow of a man of the tribe of Napthali. He was sent by Hiram King of Tyre, to Jerusalem to be Chief Architect to Solomon. Abiff, is generally interpreted as a title of respect or veneration, from the Hebrew "Abi", meaning "my father".

Sprig of Acacia: - Mackey says that it is symbolic of the immortality of the soul; it is a symbol of innocence also a symbol of death and re-birth. In the scriptures, the Acacia is known as "Shitta", or in the plural "Shittim". Wood of Acacia is considered sacred wood, used in making the Tabernacle of Moses, the Ark of the Covenant, and the sacred furniture of the Holy Place. The wood is heavier than water and is not attacked by the white ant or any other insect.


many others. At the same time, the bodies I belong to I cherish dearly and try to commit as much time as possible to those in order to get the most out of them.

From the Commander

As many people know, Memorial Day is an American holiday that is observed on the last Monday of May, and honors the men and women who sacrificed their lives while serving in the U.S. military. But how did this holiday originate?



U.S. history? This required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries.

It was Originally called Decoration Day, and from the early tradition of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths and flags, Memorial Day is now a day for remembrance of those who have died in service to our country.

Despite this, the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day in 1966.

On May 5, 1868, General John Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance.

He stated:

"The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land."

During that first national commemoration, former Union Gen. and sitting Ohio Congressman James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, after which 5,000 participants helped to decorate the graves of the more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers who were buried there.

This national event, galvanized efforts to honor and to remember fallen soldiers. It began with local observances at burial grounds in several towns throughout the United States following the end of the Civil War, such as the May I, 1865 gathering in Charleston, South Carolina organized by freed slaves to pay tribute and give proper burial to Union troops.

In 1873, the first state to designate Memorial Day as a legal holiday was New York. By the late 1800s, many more cities and communities observed Memorial Day, and several states had declared it a legal holiday.

After World War I, it became an occasion for honoring those who died in all of America's wars and was then more widely established as a national holiday throughout the United States.

From the Master of Kadosh

You may be reading this issue of the Rite Word right around Labor Day however I'm looking ahead to October.

First, a reminder to save Saturday, October 7. This will be the Consistory hosted fall Scottish Rite Burger and Dog BBQ at the Scottish Rite Center. All are invited: members, family and especially Lodge Brothers you would like to introduce the Scottish Rite to.



On a more serious note, our October Stated Meeting and Dinner will be the annual Feast of Tishri. This is an obligatory Scottish Rite observance whose roots go back centuries to the Book of Leviticus. Originally a harvest festival it celebrates the freedom the Israelites won, despite the shackles of Egypt and the armies of the Philistines. This victory is celebrated in the dedication of King Solomon's Temple.

In the story, the Lord said to Moses when the fruit of the land has been gathered, there shall be a feast of seven days. They shall dwell seven days in booths that future generations may know the Lord made Israel dwell in booths when they were brought out of Egypt. This is the Hebrew celebration Sukkot which was the origin of Tishri.

Tishri is the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar which corresponds to the Georgian month of October. During Tishri there are seven holidays on which work is not permitted and the month includes three major festivals: Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur and Sukkot. It should be noted that the number seven is the most recognized number in the Bible, used over 600 times and used the most in the Book of Revelation.

Several years ago, our III. Daniel Doornbos, 33rd Degree, gave a presentation about how Sukkot was and is observed. One writer said his synagogue had a sukkah, or booth, open to the elements. It was looked upon as a blessing to say prayers and have a meal in the sukkah during the Sukkoth festival.

During our October Stated Meeting dinner, we will observe the Feast with some toasts. Don't forget to contact the office to make your dinner reservations.

Kabbalah and the 32 Paths of Wisdom, Part 2

In last month's article, we saw how the 32 Paths of Wisdom are mapped onto the Tree of Life. We learned that the concept of the 32 Paths is derived from the 32 times that the name "Elohim" (God) is mentioned in the first chapter of the Book of Genesis. And we learned that there are two different ways to apply the Hebrew letters and assign the Path numbers, following the Hebrew Traditional and the Western Esoteric approaches.

In this article, we will look for a definition of each Path and seek its promised Wisdom. Each path is a form of consciousness, the quality or state of being aware, especially of something within oneself. The key terms here are "being aware" and "within oneself".

Being Aware

What does it mean to be aware? René Descartes [pronounced: DAY cart] (1596–1650) was a was a French philosopher, scientist, and mathematician. He coined the phrase "Cogito, ergo sum.", usually translated into English as "I think, therefore I am". That statement became a fundamental element of Western philosophy. By that principle, you are aware that you exist.

To exist is a good thing. During meditation, your author sometimes takes a few moments to enjoy his existence... just being... doing nothing, going nowhere, in want of nothing. That is also good preparation for the next step, looking within yourself.

Within Oneself

In Kabbalah, as with other mystical systems, you, as a human being, are a microcosm of the universe. Among other things, that means everything you need is already within you. This is a strange and difficult concept for most people, since we are trained to look for what we need in our environment. That works well for physical needs, such as air, food, water, shelter, clothing, medicine, education, safety, family and social relations. On the other hand, when it comes to mystical practice, you must learn to look inside yourself.

Explanations of the Paths

The Paths of Wisdom are not an expression of physical reality, something that can be observed or proven. Nor are they axioms (established principles), syllogisms (deductive reasoning), theories (speculation) or statements of fact. As we have often seen in mystical studies, words cannot fully describe a concept or idea. You have to apply your mind, spend some time, look up the meaning of words and ideas, and contemplate to reach an understanding.

Below are the explanations of each path based on those provided by the Hermetic Library. The first ten paths are represented by individual Sephiroth. Paths 11 through 32 are represented by the connections between any two Sephiroth, each identified by a letter of the Hebrew alphabet.

The paths are listed in numerical sequence, not the sequence you might use for initatory purposes. These abbreviated descriptions are for information only.

Path 1. Mystical consciousness, the light of the primordial principle which has no beginning; and it is the primal glory. No created

being can attain to its essence.

- **Path 2.** Illuminating consciousness, the splendor of the unity, like unto that which exalts itself as the head over all. The masters of Kabbalah call it the second glory.
- **Path 3.** Sanctifying consciousness, the foundation of primordial wisdom and is called enduring faith and its roots are truth. It is the father of trust, from which the power of faith emanates.
- **Path 4.** Overflowing consciousness, from which emanate all the holy powers, all the most ethereal emanations with the most sublime essences. They emanate one from the other through the power of the primordial emanator.
- **Path 5.** Root consciousness, the substance of the unity, joining itself to that understanding, which itself emanates from within the province of primordial wisdom.
- **Path 6.** Mediating consciousness, through which the emanation of atziluthic (highest olam or world) influence is increased. It causes that influence to flow unto all those so blessed as to be united to its essence.
- **Path 7.** Hidden consciousness, the radiance that illuminates all the powers of the mind which are seen with the eye of the intellect and through the contemplation of truth.
- **Path 8.** Perfect consciousness, the plan of the primordial. It has no root where it can abide except in the hidden chambers of majesty from which its own secret essence emanates.
- **Path 9.** Pure consciousness, purifies the essence of the Sephiroth. It provides and adapts the design of their patterns and establishes their unity. They remain united, without diminution or division.
- **Path 10.** Resplendent consciousness, exalted above every head and sits on the throne of Binah. It is illuminated with the splendor of all the lights and it causes an influence to flow forth from the Prince of Countenances.
- **Path 11.** Scintillating consciousness, the essence of the veil which is placed before the ordered arrangement of the powers. Who walks this way acquires a special dignity—he can stand face to face before the cause of causes.
- **Path 12.** Transparent consciousness, the substance of that phase of majesty which is called revelation. It is the source of prophesies that seers behold in visions.
- **Path 13.** Uniting consciousness, the essence of glory. It represents the completion of the true essence of the unified spiritual beings.
- **Path 14.** Luminous consciousness, the essence of the Chashmal (a modern Hebrew acrostic that means "speaking silence") the instructor in the secret foundations of holiness and their stages of preparation.

- **Path 15.** Constituting consciousness, it constitutes the essence of creation in pure darkness. According to masters of contemplation, this is that darkness referred to in Job 38:9 as "and thick darkness its swaddling band".
- **Path 16.** Eternal consciousness, the pleasure of the ultimate glory beyond which is no-glory like unto it. It is also called the garden of pleasure (Eden), which is prepared for the compassionate.
- **Path 17.** Consciousness of disposition, it provides faith to the compassionate and clothes them with the Ruach ha Kodesh (Holy Spirit). Within the supernals it is called the foundation of beauty.
- **Path 18.** Consciousness of the house of influence. From its inmost center flow the Arcanum (secret or mystery) and veiled ideas, which abide in its shadow, thus is there union with the inmost substance of the cause of causes.
- **Path 19.** Consciousness of the secret of all spiritual activities, the influence disseminated by it is from the highest blessing and the supernal glory.
- **Path 20.** Consciousness of will, the pattern of all that is formed. By this mode of consciousness one may know the actuality of the primordial wisdom.
- **Path 21.** Consciousness of the desired, which receives the divine influence which flows into it as a result of the blessing it confers upon all that exists.
- **Path 22.** Faithful consciousness, through which the spiritual powers are increased. All dwellers on earth abide in its shadow.
- **Path 23.** Stable consciousness, the power of sustenance among all the Sephiroth.
- **Path 24.** Imaginative consciousness, which provides an image to all created things that have an appearance, in a form fitting to each.
- **Path 25.** Consciousness of trial, the primary test by which the creator proves the compassionate.
- **Path 26.** Renewing consciousness, through which God renews all things which are newly begun in the creation of the world.
- **Path 27.** Exciting consciousness, through which is created the lifebreath of every created being under the supreme orb, as well as the motion of them all.
- **Path 28.** Natural consciousness, through which is completed the nature of all that exists beneath the sphere of the sun.
- **Path 29.** Corporeal consciousness, which marks out the forms and reproduction of all bodies which are incorporated under every cycle of the heavens.
- **Path 30.** Universal consciousness, through which the masters of the heavens derive their judgments of the stars and constellations, and perfect their knowledge of the celestial cycles.

Path 31. Perpetual consciousness, which directs the movements of the sun and moon according to

their natural order, each in its proper orbit.

Path 32. Serving consciousness, which directs the motion of the seven planets, each in its own proper course.

So where is the diagram of the Tree of Life, so I can see a map of each path? A perfectly logical question. But in this case, the wrong question. This article is about the many forms of consciousness. So ask about **them**. And then search for their meanings.

Beehive: - Why is a beehive frequently used in connection with Masonic designs and illustrations? The beehive is an emblem of industry, and emphasizes the desirability of that virtue.

Blazing Star: - What is the Blazing Star? The Blazing Star is described as one of the "Ornaments" of the Lodge, and is moralized on thus: "The Blazing Star or Glory in the Centre refers us to the sun, which enlightens the earth and by its benign influence dispenses its blessings to mankind".

Why the Rough Sands of the Sea Shore? Entered Apprentices are often puzzled by the reference, "to the rough sands of the sea where the tide regularly ebbs and flows twice in every twenty--four hours." This is a survival of an old superstition. The sea shore, covered by high tide and exposed at low tide, is neither land nor water and anyone buried there would never find rest, but would roam throughout eternity.

The federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day in 1966. For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30th, the date General Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.

Today Memorial Day is commemorated at Arlington National Cemetery each year with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. Traditionally, the President or Vice President lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
