


# The Rite Word - Valley of San Jose



#### A PAST MASTER'S VIEW

The Worshipful Master extended to me an invitation to provide an article in this month's Trestle Board. Of course, I said yes as it was his will and pleasure. I have chosen this opportunity to once again briefly ponder on my definition of Freemasonry and a few thoughts on the Masonic initiatic experience. So here we go.



"Freemasonry is a modern - day Mystery School which, through its' progressive, moral science, is a transformational experience taking an initiate from darkness to light through its ancient teachings and the practice of the lessons inculcated in it".

I have always found the idea that Masonry is an organization that "allows good men to become better men" unsatisfactory. It seems to me it could just as well apply to the Rotarians or many other worthy groups who do good work. I think the definition I proffer implies a more spiritual journey and I believe that Masonic mystic teachings offer an ideal path to follow to find further light.

With that in mind, I think each of us should assess the initiatic experience we provide to a duly and truly qualified candidate for our mysteries.

Is it possible to provide this experience in 90 to 180 days which is rather typical of most modern lodges? I think not. It reminds me of the "90-day wonder". I always like to think in qualitative rather than quantitative terms when it comes to considering applicants for our valuable philosophy of life. Not every good man who knocks at our door is a candidate for our degrees. He might just be looking for an opportunity to serve his community or for comradery with good men.

I hope all will be enjoying a nice relaxing day off this upcoming Labor Day. The first state bill brought to legislation was in New York, but the first to pass into law was Oregon on February 21, 1887. By 1894, 23 of our states had adopted the holiday to pay tribute to the working man and woman.

This month also marks a special time of the year. On the equinox, night and day are nearly exactly the same length - 12 hours - all over the world. This is the reason it's called an "equinox," derived from Latin, meaning "equal night." The staircases are built at a carefully calculated angle which makes it look like an enormous snake of sunlight slithers down the stairs on the day of the equinox. I hope the experience encourages all Brothers to have a renewed vigor in learning the moral and philosophical lessons behind all of the degrees! To that end, I encourage all of you to consider attending the Master Craftsman program that Gregg Hall is currently organizing.



As an additional opportunity for new and experienced Scottish Rite Masons, Mark Scoggins, Ketan Jashapara, and I are forming a group called "Rite Thought". Our first meeting will be held in the San Jose Scottish Rite Library at 7:30PM on September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2018, and Mark will present a paper on the intersection of Rosicrucianism and Scottish Rite Freemasonry. The focus of the new group is on achieving an understanding of the various Scottish Rite degrees including the philosophical messages and symbolism. Our meetings will occur every January, March, May, July, September on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday at 7:30PM at the San Jose Scottish Rite. We are limiting attendance to Scottish Rite Masons only and encourage all to attend. The format will typically include a main speaker and presentation followed by discussion and discourse.

The Symbolism of Chalk, Charcoal, and Clay in the Entered Apprentice Degree and Scottish Rite

An interesting set of symbols in the Entered Apprentice degree is that of Chalk, Charcoal, and Clay. Chalk is associated with Freedom. Charcoal is associated with Fervency, and Clay with Zeal. The main lesson is that the Entered Apprentice must engage in his Masonic Journey with the attitude of a free person, meaning being done willingly, without restraint, and enthusiasm. Additionally, he must be diligent and have ardent affection towards his work. However, more interestingly is the tie of the symbolic representations to alchemy. Alchemists and Freemasons are related in that they both engaged in the same process, but by using different lexicons. Freemasons embark upon the Great Work through the builder's allegory, whereas Alchemists seek to reveal the Elixir of Life through the Philosophers Stone. This is analogous the Freemasons conceptualization of the Perfec Ashlar.

#### The Fourteenth and Thirty-Third Degree Rings

Purity of Honor, integrity of the Sword, spotlessness of the Shield, these were the three highest ideals of the Ancient knights. "Honor that never broke the faith with any one" was supreme and preserved despite anger or personal loss. "Integrity of the Sword in never failing to draw in defense of innocence and right" was a duty embraced with fervor and acted upon with courage. "the Shield never to be sullied by protecting oppression and wrong" was the symbol of each Brother's dedication to the knighthood. When the anciet knight passed to his eternal home, he bequeathed his Honor, Sword, and Shield to another, one near and dear, one he knew would carry on his quest unblemished and victorious.

The Scottish Rite Fourteenth Degree Ring likewise Symbolizes these noble virtues. Eloquently simple, it is a flat, plain band of gold or other material resembling gold, and embossed thereon is an engraved or enameled plate in the form of an equilateral triangle and within the triangle the Hebrew letter yud. The triangle and yud are the oldest traditional symbols of the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Degrees, and they symbolize the True Master's Word of the Third Degree. Inside the ring is inscribed the Scottish Rite Motto; Virtus Junxit, Mors Non Separabit (Virtue has united and death shall not spate). The ring's circle expresses the unbreakable fraternal bond between Masons of all generations. According to the ritual, it should be kept during the owner's lifetime unless superseded by a 33° ring should the owner ever attain that honor. Upon the death of the owner, the ring should go into the hands of his widow, eldest son, the friend who was loved above all others, or another Scottish Rite Freemason.

Although the ring may be altered to fit the new Brother's Finger, it need not be changed. There is no official instruction designating on what finger it should be worn. The direction of the triangle's apex is irrelevant so long as the ring is worn with honor appropriate to the deceased Brother, his fraternal heir, and the Rite. As an Evidence of the authenticity, the wearing of the Scottish Rite ring is mandatory under our rituals, yows, laws, regulations, and customs.

To draw attention to the importance of the ring, a number of Valleys have elicited enthusiasm among the Brethren by opening the Fourteenth Degree Ring Ceremony, with a combined ring and cap presentation, to general family attendance. For such occasions, memorable thoughts con-

cerning this honored Masonic tradition may be distributed in the form of the essay, "il Your Scottish Rite Ring Could Speak:"

#### If your Scottish Rite Ring Could Speak

Suppose by some miracle your Scottish Rite ring could speak, what would it say?

"I SYMBOLIZE the Scottish Rite and, as such, like Aladdin's lamp, I am possessed of miraculous powers, for....

"I BRING YOU riches far greater than all the wealth of the fabled El Dorado: I can summon to you the help and the strength of your Scottish Rite Brethren throughout the nations of worldwide Masonry....

"I BRING YOU the grandeur and the splendor of the Scottish Rite Ritual:

That portrayal from antiquity through the golden pen in poetry and the sacred fire in drama that inculcates lofty patriotic sentiments, high moral values, and noble spiritual aspirations....

"I BRING YOU the magnetism of a Scottish Rite Mission' that never-ending fight for human rights and resources—freedom of the body, freedom of the mind, freedom of the soul.....

"I BRING YOU the beauty of a Scottish Rite Vision: That revelation of truth and of greatness dimly seen in the mystic light that follows purification, initiation, and moral perfection...

I BRING YOU the insight of a Scottish Rite Philosophy: That progress in human development which transforms natural ignorance into sublime wisdom, self-discovery, self-awareness, and self-enrichment...

I BRING YOU the confidence of Scottish Rite Courage: That self reliance in daily living born of an abiding faith in the guidance of Him Who holds the whole wide world in His hands..

"THESE are some of the things I bring to you, a true Freemason of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry

From Forms and Traditions of the Scottish Rite

Jacob is a five-year-old boy who attended speech and language therapy services at our clinic from May 2017 until July 2018. Jacob loves to play with his twin sister, Colette, and his older sister, Sophia. He also loves his



scooter, playing with his Scooby Doo toys, and playing with his cat. Lately, he has been asking his mom for another kitten! He is very talkative and playful in therapy and has many stories to share with Miss Karen. He loves to tell stories about his twin sister and his cat. He is often thinking of others and always requests that we give a prize to his sister at the end of the session as well.

Jacob was referred to the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic by his pediatrician when he was two years old. He had a history of many ear infections and fluid in his ears, requiring pressure-equalizing tubes to be placed when he was two years told. He had to have them replaced this April. Jacob's hearing was being affected by the frequent ear infections and the fluid in the middle ear and he was missing out on exposure to many high frequency sounds during a period of his childhood that was very critical to speech and language development. This may also have contributed to him omitting the final consonant from words.

Jacob's speech therapy sessions at our clinic focused on the elimination of phonological processes, production of multisyllabic words, articulation of various speech sounds, and expressive language. One of Jacob's phonological processes is Final Consonant Deletion, when a child omits the last sound in a word, such as leaving the last /p/ sound off of the word "pop." He was also missing many speech sounds, such as /f/, /v/, /k/, /g/, /s/, "sh," "ch," "j", /l/ and /r/. Jacob would replace many sounds in the middle of the word with an /h/ sound, even when the middle sound was a sound that he was currently able to make, such as producing "baby" as "bay-hee." He now has more awareness of this and he uses many more consonant sounds in the middle of words. He has greatly expanded his speech sound inventory (the collection of sounds he is able to produce) and is now able to imitate /f/, /v/, /s/ at the word level. He is now also producing / p/, /b/, /t/, /d/, /k/, /g/ in all positions of words when prompted and given feedback to correct himself if he eliminates it in the final word position. "Prior to getting speech therapy, Jacob would replace many sounds with an "H" Sound. He couldn't say any "S" sounds and left out many sounds in the middle of words," said Laurin, Jacob's mother, "Since treatment began, he's more aware of saying the middle sounds of words such as "popping" instead of "poh-hing" He is so much more clear in his speaking now."

Jacob's family has worked hard with him at home to enforce carryover of the skills that he has learned with Miss Karen. "We have all tried to help him out when needed as he gets frustrated when we don't understand him. The sounds that are being worked on that week in therapy are focused on during the week at home as well."

Jacob's mother said, "We've greatly appreciated how generous Scottish Rite has been with letting Jacob get therapy for his speech free of charge. We are so grateful, and have seen such a huge improvement in his speech." They have also enjoyed their experience here because, "The experience has been very easy. We are able to watch him through the double-sided window as he gets his therapy and we see him using many fun toys to play and learn at the same time. He's always rewarded at the end of his session which has helped his focus during his session."

Laurin's advice for other parents is: "I would tell other parents to seek out as much help as possible and as early as possible. The sooner you get help the better for the child. Jacob couldn't hear many soft sounds because he had a lot of fluid behind his ear drum. We didn't realize it at the time because everyone was telling us boys speak later than girls. Luckily the doctor told us that is not really the case and we got help. Had we been more aware he could have been treated even earlier. Also it's very important to work with your child at home every day as well as getting regular therapy."

Jacob, you and your family will be greatly missed at our clinic. Jacob had to discontinue services at our clinic when he and his family moved away in July to

be near their family in Louisiana and start a new chapter. We will miss you and your silly and cheerful antics! We wish the Antonowitsch family the best in Louisiana!

The Alchemist can apply the heat of the Charcoal to the base substance of Clay and create symbolic spiritual gold. However, before this can be performed Chalk must be used to instruct the Alchemist on how to perform the process, known as the *opus alchymicum*. Therefore, Calk represents the knowledge, Charcoal represents the method, and Clay represents the substance through which the Elixir of Life can be created. Freemasonry and Alchemy are related as they describe the same process of spiritual purification of the Great Work, and so these symbols exist in the Entered Apprentice degree.

A possible Scottish Rite connection to the references of Chalk, Charcoal, and Clay in the Entered Apprentice degree are the various colored hats that we wear. The 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree "Black Hat" could be related to Charcoal, as Charcoal is typically black. The Knight Commander Court of Honor (KCCH) "Red Hat" could be related to Clay, as Clay is typically red. Finally, the 33<sup>rd</sup> Degree "White Hat" might be related to Chalk, as Chalk is normally white. As such, the "White Hats" provide the instruction and knowledge, and the combination of the "Black Hat", Charcoal, as applied to the "Red Hat", Clay, allows for Alchemical transmutation.

Finally, early on in Alchemical process, a black substance is created through a burning process before a white substance called "Manna" is created. Every plant is said to contain some amount of Manna, and, coincidentally, Acacia has a very high concentration. Manna is used ultimately to create a red substance called the "Red Lion" or the "Sangre De Christo", Blood of Christ. The Red Lion is considered by some to be the Elixir of Life or the Philosopher's Stone and is what is used to transmute base metals into gold.
