From the Master of Kadosh

I am honored to be the Master of Kadosh, San Jose Consistory for 2019.

I come from a Masonic family. My father belonged to Scottish Rite in Oakland. In 1974 I joined Masonry and became a Master Mason of California #I in San Francisco, with my father as Master of the Lodge and my brother as 3rd base. My father introduced me to Scottish Rite in Oakland. However, I began my Scottish Rite degrees in San Francisco and completed my degrees in San Jose.

Our charity, Rite Care, touches my heart as our son was born deaf. Learning to speak and to read lips was difficult for him. Although his oral language needs were addressed by special classes/school and therapists, we became very aware of the needs of children with speech disabilities and all the repercussions. It affects them all their lives.

In the 90's, my wife, Sandy, and I participated in a Los Altos Masonic Tour of England and Scotland lead by Brother Ed Fenton. During our tour we visited Scotland and England's Grand Lodges, Templar churches, very old English Masonic Lodge Rooms and toured the Rosslyn Chapel before it became so popular. The Masonic influence Great Brittan has had on the US is significant and has made us very aware of how deep our Masonic roots are.

The more one learns of Masonry and Scottish Rite, the more you want to learn.

Giles Morgan's Freemasonry, Its History and Myths Revealed goes into detail about how Masonry has been the victim of international bigotry and intolerance. Of particular note was Gabriel Jogand-Poges, writing as Leo Taxil in the 1880's Paris, France. He became a Mason, but was eventually rejected by the Brotherhood. He adopted Catholicism and wrote a number of books exposing the secrets of Masonry, portraying "Freemasons as satanic and devil worshipers who engaged is the most appalling and debased behavior during their rites and rituals" His works were very popular in Europe. His works on Masonry were also anti-Semitic and 'portrayed the ceremonies as fantastical and demonic." He wrote that the punishment for Masons "who betrayed the Brotherhood secrets was potential death." He concluded that the Masons must be ready to commit murder. The Pope Leo XIII rewarded the author with a special honor of the Order of the Holy Sepulcher for his attacks on Masonry.

I am very proud to be a Member of Masonry and Scottish Rite.

The Seventh Degree

The Seventh Degree, Provost and Judge, features a drama that takes place during the construction of King Solomon's Temple. The main character is Zabud, who is a Provost and Judge. In the course of the story, two operative masons, Naboth and Uriah, attempt to win Zabud's favor and influence his decision in a matter among the workmen.

"Judge not, that ye be not judged" is the motto of this degree. It comes from the King James Bible, Matthew Chapter 7, verses I through 5. You can look that up for yourself. In order to more easily understand its meaning, here is the passage from the Common English Version of the Bible:

"Don't condemn others, and God won't condemn you. God will be as hard on you as you are on others! He will treat you exactly as you treat them. You can see the speck in your friend's eye, but you don't notice the log in your own eye. How can you say, 'My friend, let me take the speck out of your eye,' when you don't see the log in your own eye? You're nothing but show-offs! First, take the log out of your own eye. Then you can see how to take the speck out of your friend's eye."

What does that passage have to do with this degree? Yery little, actually. Yet is does illustrate two different meanings of the word, to judge. To judge can mean to make a decision based on evidence and arguments presented, which is what happens in this degree. Or it can mean to condemn something or somebody, which was the point of this lesson from the Sermon on the Mount.

The word Provost may be pronounced $PR\bar{O}$ vost or $PR\bar{O}$ vo. In ancient times, a Provost was an officer whose duty it was to ensure that the King's army did not harm the citizens of the realm. Today a Provost may be the mayor of a Scottish town, a senior advisor at a university, or the chief of a military police force.

In ancient Israel, the Judges were tribal chieftains who ruled from the death of Joshua until the time of the kings (Saul, David, Solomon, and so on.) Generally speaking, a judge is a public official authorized to de-

cide questions brought before a court. The latter sense applies to this degree.

In the Seventh Degree, a Provost and Judge is both police officer and judge of the court. From a 21st Century American perspective, we would say that the roles of police officer and judge must be performed by two different people, because the police necessarily have a prosecutorial approach to the case. But we want impartiality in a judge. And a defense to look out for the interests of the accused, as well.

Now for the ethnic distinctions.

A Phonecian is a person from Phonecia, an ancient country at the eastern shore of the Mediterranean Sea, where modern Lebanon and parts of Syria and Israel are today. It included the city of Tyre, from which King Hiram of Tyre comes.

A Hebrew is descendant from one or more of the tribes of Israel, an Israelite. The term Hebrew was normally used by Israelites when speaking of themselves to foreigners and used by foreigners when speaking about Israelites.

Around the First Century, many Israelites lived in what was, at that time, the Roman province of Judea. The predominant religion of those Israelites was called "Judea-ism," or Judaism. Thus the followers of the Hebrew/Israelite faith acquired the name "Jews". Note that even in the First Century, not all people living in Judea were Israelites or Jews. Just as not all people living in Israel today are Jewish.

Back to the Seventh Degree.

Uriah, a Fellowcraft, has hired some Phonecian masons to help build the south wall of the Temple site. Some Phonecians were members of the Craft, but not the ones that Uriah employed.

once a week since July 2017. She is being discharged from our clinic soon to be placed back at the end of our waitlist due to our 18-month time limit policy. Miss Karen also sees Anna's three-year-old sister, Esther for speech and language therapy services at our clinic and has enjoyed getting to know her family over the last year and a half.

Anna's adoptive mother and father Erika and David Spence first adopted Anna's older brother, Eli, eight years ago in 2011. In 2015, Eli's biological father and his girlfriend lost custody of Anna when she was four months old. The Spences requested to adopt Anna so that the two half -siblings could grow up in the same family. Erika and David ended up adopting Anna and her two younger sisters who were born in 2015. All three girls presented with speech and language delays and overall developmental delays. They have adjusted well into their new home and are much healthier, happier, and are now receiving services to meet their needs in speech therapy, physical therapy, and educational needs.

During therapy, Anna has been working on expanding her vocabulary, such as adding verbs to her repertoire, increasing her utterance length, improving her ability to imitate the L sound, and improving her articulation of multisyllabic words. She has worked very hard and made tremendous progress. Anna enjoys playing with the barbie dolls, horses, and cars during our therapy sessions. She has also become well known in the clinic amongst the other clients and parents who attend speech therapy around the same time as her. She has become very social with the other children at the clinic, initiating conversations with them, playing with them in the waiting room. The other speech-language pathologists and parents at this clinic have been offering Anna a lot of praise recently about her progress in her

speech clarity and expressive language!

Anna's mother learned about our clinic when she was looking for resources for her eldest child. Prior to receiving services at this clinic, Anna's mother reported that her language was disorganized. She was difficult to understand due to having few words and multiple articulation errors. She is now speaking in short sentences and her speech clarity has improved signficantly. Her mother reports that the most rewarding part about receiving services here has been seeing Anna gaining confidence and self-worth. "Our experience has been very good. Anna's therapist is very kind, patient, and professional. It has been such an excellent resource." Anna's family is thankful for our services and would tell other parents about the clinic.

Naboth, a Master Mason, but not Uriah's supervisor, objects to the use of foreigners, saying they pollute the Temple because they are not Hebrews and don't believe in the Hebrew religion. Furthermore, they take jobs and receive wages that should go to Hebrew workers. Even though some Phonecians were members of the Craft, Naboth wants to get rid of all of them.

Naboth tells Uriah to fire his Phonecian masons immediately. Naboth refuses. The case then has to go before Zabud, the Provost and Judge.

Naboth and Uriah both want to ensure that they win the case. So each of them comes separately to Zabud, seeking to influence his decision ex parte. Ex parte is a legal term that means "one side or party" of a legal proceeding. In a court, both sides are supposed to get a fair and equal hearing. That is why jurors are instructed to consider only what has been presented during the trial, and to ignore any additional information or opinions published in the news or on social media.

First, Naboth approaches Zabud and tells him that the Phonecian masons do excellent work and they don't insist on Master Masons' wages. Then he mentions their friendship and mutual desire to please the king, and expresses hope that Zabud will rule in his favor. Instead, Zabud tells Naboth to get lost, emphasizing that in his role of Provost and Judge he must be impartial, therefore it is as if Zabud did not "know" Naboth.

Then Uriah comes to see Zabud. He points out that the Phonecian masons worship other gods, such as Baal, Astarte, and Melqart; rather than the God of the Hebrews. According to Uriah, even those Phonecians who are members of the Craft are not "true" Freemasons. And the Phonecians take jobs and wages that should go to the Hebrews. This time, Zabud points out that there is no law forbidding the hiring of non-Hebrew workers. And that the unjust man, who takes it upon himself to make and enforce his own laws, is accursed.

We can see a number of contemporary issues here, such as immigration, employment of foreign workers, hiring non-Union or unlicensed workers, and even

which religions qualify a man to be a Freemason. This degree does not propose answers to these questions. But it does suggest that we should research and consider all the facts, and then restrain our passions when working through such matters.

By the way, according to archaeologists, most of the skilled work on King Solomon's Temple, was probably done by foreign workers. The evidence suggests that they were Assyrians, rather than Phonecians, however. Foreign labor was needed because the Hebrews were mostly a pastoral people. Today, we would consider them to be farmers and ranchers. They would have required expert help to build the mighty temple. Just as all those skilled masons would depend on the local people for their food and drink.
