





From the Secretary's Table:

Brethren All:

At our November stated meeting, I had the unpleasant task of asking you to confirm the actions of my office in suspending a number of members for non-payment of dues. Nothing in my experience as your Secretary has distressed me more.

After a brief conversation with Ill. Nagel (with his concurrence) I decided to dedicate my message this month to some definitions which will become evident as you read this.

* * * * * *

<u>IN GOOD STANDING</u>. As in all Masonic bodies, dues notices are issued before the end of each calendar year and payment is due before the end of that year. Therefore, on January first

of each calendar year, if your dues have not yet been paid, you are NOT IN GOOD STANDING AND you are delinquent.

DUES REMISSION: a Body may, by a majority vote, with the consent of the Sovereign Grand Inspector General or Deputy of the Supreme Council, remit Delinquent dues. Confirmation of the actions of the Secretary's office is an acceptable practice since dues remission is a private matter between the member and the Lodge.

DEMISSION: A Demit from membership may be issued for any member who is IN GOOD STANDING.

SUSPENSION: Annual dues are payable by December 31 of the year preceding the applicable current dues year. And the time of suspension of a member in arrears of dues may be fixed at not less than one year.

<u>RESTORATION</u>: A member suspended for nonpayment of dues who shall within tow years pay the arrearages due at the time of his suspension, together with current year's dues shall be automatically restored.

SENIOR MEMBERS: The Grand Commander may waive the Supreme Council's per capita assessment on "Senior Members" (those who are either 80 years of age or have reached 50 years or more of total membership) *who are in financial need* in conjunction with their Valleys waiving their annual dues. (This is an annual event and is not permanent.)

<u>DUES EXEMPTION</u>: A Body may, by a unanimous vote at a regular meeting and with the consent of the Sovereign Grand Inspector General or Deputy of the Supreme Council, exempt from the payment of dues to said Body any member whose circumstances justify such exemption, but in such case the Body is not relieved from paying to the Supreme Council the per capita assessment for the member so exempted.

From the Clíníc!

Mia is an adorable 9 year old girl who started services at our clinic secondary to a diagnosis of Childhood Apraxia of Speech or CAS. Children with CAS have difficulty planning the movement sequences of speech. Often children with CAS are very quiet when they are babies and toddlers and speech is very slow to develop. When Mia first started treatment, she was shy and hardly used any words. Often Mia would attempt to say something but she was misunderstood. Longer utterances were a jumble of sounds and she was intelligible about only 10% of the time. It was difficult for Mia to express her opinions, carry on a conversation, or get her needs met at home and at school.

At first treatment focused on getting Mia to say anything. Rachel, Mia's speech -language pathologist, would use what is called "parallel play" in which she

would play next to Mia with an identical or similar toy and imitate Mia's play. The purpose of this treatment strategy was to generate trust and to decrease "pressure" on Mia to talk. Eventually, Mia started talking...a lot! She continues to need help with sequencing her sounds in words and carrying over what she has learned to functional speech tasks, but she has made exceptional progress.

Her parents report that her speech "has improved dramatically" as they can now understand her and can engage in conversation with her. Mia is better able to let people know her needs, feelings and opinions. As a matter of fact, since Mia has become more intelligible, she now expresses her opinions often during her treatment sessions!

"We have [had] a very pleasant experience at the clinic. Ms. Rachel is very nice, kind and understanding. She always gives us an update of our child's development and areas where she needs more help...We would like to recognize Ms. Rachel's hard work and knowledge. Our child is becoming more and more like most [other] kids and continues to keep her good nature, joy and confidence."



December 2011 ~ Clinic Director's Message

On behalf of the San Jose Scottish Rite Language Disorders Clinic, I would like to invite all of you to our annual Holiday Party to be held at 1 PM on Saturday, December 3, 2011 at the San Jose Scottish Rite Center. I have it on good authority that Santa Claus is expected to make an appearance!

During October 2011, the clinic completed 226 treatment hours, up from 191 hours in September. Two (2) children were discharged from services and four (4) children were added to the caseload. We are currently helping 53 children and have 106 children on our waiting list for speech and language services.

Brethren all,

he following is an excerpt from an article by the Grand Lecturer of the Grand Lodge of Hawaii, pub-L lished in the Fall 2011 edition of the Hawaii Freemason.

Should we rely on the Investigating Committee?

It used to be a lot more difficult to get into our fraternity. Lodges were full, applications were abundant and blackballs were common. Nowadays we suffer from dwindling rosters, and are ecstatic just to receive an application. Thus, we happily welcome almost anyone to receive the Degrees, and casting the dreaded black cube has become akin to an act of treason.

We've all heard the passionate declarations by one or more of our brethren that a black ball rejects not only the applicant, but the two recommenders and the investigating committee as well. Therefore, the argument continues, we should not be so quick to substitute our own judgment for those who supposedly know the applicant better than we, or who spent the time and effort to investigate and report on the application.

I am NOT advocating the black ball, and I do think it is un-Masonic to "cube" someone for no sound reason. However, I wish to point out that our faith in the recommenders is often misplaced. We see it all the time. Your close friend comes up to you before the stated meeting and says, "Brother Dennis, I want you to meet Joe Applicant. He's really a good guy. Can you sign his application as a recommender?"

Or how about the newbie who has come to several Lodge dinners, meets a bunch of the members, and even helps in the kitchen. You engage in a couple of conversations with him, and he seems like a "nice guy". Just before the next stated meeting he comes to you with his application and asks you to recommend him for membership.

In either of the foregoing instances (or in similar circumstances) are you going to turn the request down? Probably not. So the argument that we should trust in the judgment of the recommenders does not always ring true. At most we are often relying on only one recommender, who has vouched for the applicant's character to the second recommender. And what if the top-line signer himself just met the applicant B over the phone?

Thus, the determination of the worthiness of the applicant will most often depend upon the judgment of the investigators. This is why a thorough investigation is essential to the welfare of the Lodge and to the Craft. Whenever we cast our ballots for an applicant whom we do not know (or whom we do not know well), we are trusting that the Master and the Investigating Committee have done their jobs properly.

I thought that this would get out to more Masons than something in any one Lodge's Trestleboard.
