#### From the Clinic



avid is a 6 year old young man who comes to our clinic for speech and language therapy. He is a polite and fun boy, who is a delight to work with. Some of David's favorite activities include outdoor activities, reading books and building with legos. David is currently in kindergarten. His mother was referred to our clinic by a friend and David's older brother is a previous client who was seen by Ms. Jenna for speech-language therapy.



David comes from a bilingual Korean family, who speak mainly Korean at home. English is mainly used at school and playing with friends. His family noticed that he couldn't pronounce certain sounds in English and wasn't confident in his language skills. He was quiet and not very interactive with friends at school.

When tested at our clinic, David was demonstrating some language characteristics common for children who use English as their second language. Beyond just those characteristics, he was also demonstrating difficulties producing sounds and with expressive language production.

Goals were established for David that targeted /r, th and s/ with /s/ specifically being the most difficult. David exhibits a frontal lisp when producing /s/ meaning his tongue protrudes outward causing a distorted sound. Other goals have targeted language development such prepositions, plurals and past tense verbs.

David has progressed quickly and met many of his targeted goals. He continues to work on grammar, sentence building, past tense verbs and articulation. After treatment began David's mother has noticed, "He started to pronounce sounds correctly and seemed more confident with his English conversations. He is a kindergartener and I am very happy to see him mingle more with his friends."

David's mom commented, "We are so thankful that we can get a very quality therapy without any fees. In addition to that, the clinic has good therapists and a warm environment. My two sons have been treated at the clinic and as a mother of a bilingual family; we are so thankful that the program is here. Thank you!!"

### Scottish Rite Special VMAP & Masonic Education Event





#### "Holiness to the Lord."

YOU ARE TO BE CONSECRATED to the service of the Children of Light, and shown the Tabernacle in the wilderness, which we are told is a symbol of the universe. In the eyes of the ancients, man was considered a microcosm, or reflection of the universe; hence the Hermetic dictum "As above, so below." We draw upon it allegorically to represent the establishment of a rebuilt mind and character according to the plan as laid out on the trestleboard of life by God. The tabernacle is a tent, a temporary dwelling place for the spirit if God, represented by the Ark. When the tabernacle was ordered built by God, he promised a permanent dwelling lace would eventually be made.

reetings Brethren,

The other day I watched a program about a number of famous physicist and their various contributions to science. The most fascinating part, of course, was on Albert Einstein and his general theory of relativity, which forms the foundation of our modern understanding of the force of gravity.

Einstein's theory has opened up a universe that never ceases to surprise — black holes, the big bang, dark energy, gravitational waves — jolting us out of the grooves of thought that we fall into all too easily. Yet the ink was barely dry on it when Einstein first saw a problem. It contradicted quantum mechanics, suggesting that physicists needed an even deeper theory to unify these two pillars of fundamental physics.

A theory of gravity is a theory of space and time — that was Einstein's great insight. Yet physicists have always formulated their theories within space and time. So, a theory of gravity swallows its own tail. Einstein's theory supposes, for example, that the passage of time varies, but the word "varies" connotes a temporal process. If time is varying, then the very standard by which it is varying also varies. The whole situation threatens to become paradoxical. This conceptual circularity creates weird mathematical difficulties.

String theory, loop quantum gravity, causal-set theory: these are just a few of the approaches that theorists have taken. Naturally, proponents of each are convinced the others are misguided or simply unscientific. But when you take a step back from the dispute, you notice all agree on one essential lesson: the space-time that we inhabit is a construction. It is not fundamental to nature, but emerges from a deeper level of reality. In some way or other, it consists of primitive building blocks — "atoms" of space — and takes on its familiar properties from how those building blocks are assembled.

These "atoms" are clearly nothing like ordinary atoms such as hydrogen or oxygen. For one thing, they are not tiny, because the word "tiny" is a spatial description and these atoms are supposed to create space, not presuppose it. Yet many of the same principles apply. Water, for example, consists of H2O molecules. It can undergo a change of state — freezing or boiling — as those molecules rearrange themselves into new structures. The same might be true of space. If those atoms can assemble themselves into space, presumably they could also reassemble into other structures. And that might explain many of the mysteries of modern physics.

Consider black holes. If you fell into one, Einstein's theory predicts your timeline would end. You would certainly die, but that'd be the least of it. The atoms in your body would simply cease to be. Instead of ashes to ashes, you'd have ashes to ... nothingness. The new emergent space-time theories suggest a different picture in which space undergoes a change of state in a black hole. The black hole does not have an interior volume; its perimeter marks where space melts. The result is a new state that is no longer spatial and is scarcely even imaginable in human terms. If you fell in, you would probably still die, but the atoms in your body would still carry on in some new form.

Consider, also, the big bang. Like black holes, it has always posed something of a paradox. The ordinary laws of physics, operating within time, are inherently unable to explain the beginning of time. According to those laws, something must precede the big bang to set it into motion. Yet nothing is supposed to precede it. A way out of the paradox is to think of the big bang not as the beginning but as a transition, when space crystallized from a primeval state of spacelessness.

Finally, consider the mysterious phenomena of quantum nonlocality — what Einstein <u>called</u> "spooky action at a distance." Two or more particles can act in a coordinated way, no matter how far apart they may be, and they do so without sending out a sound wave, beaming a radio signal or otherwise communicating across the gap that separates them. The particles behave as though they are not, in fact, separated. And one possible explanation is that the particles are rooted in the deeper level of reality where distance has no meaning.

To be sure, this is all still speculation — but it is constrained speculation. Scientists didn't dream up these ideas over drinks after work. They were driven to them by combining the principles of Einstein's theory and of quantum theory and seeing where the path takes them. By the very nature of research, we don't know what these ideas mean or even if they're right. But we do know that humans have not yet grasped all there is to grasp about the universe. And when we do take the next step, the effects will surely propagate into our broader culture. Just as learning something new makes you a better person, so too will learning something new about the universe propel humanity to the next level.
