Thanksgiving Day is a National Holiday held primarily in Canada and the United States. However, it is celebrated also in many countries such as Liberia, Grenada, and United Kingdom. The Thanksgiving holiday history in North America is rooted in English traditions dating from the Protestant Reformation, however, in the West Indian island of Grenada, the celebration marks the anniversary of the U.S.-led invasion of the island in 1983, in response to the deposition and execution of the Grenadian Prime Minister. In the United States, the modern Thanksgiving holiday tradition is commonly, but not universally, traced to a sparsely documented 1621 celebration at Plymouth in present day Massachusetts. In Canada, the first Canadian Thanksgiving is often traced back to 1578 and the explorer Martin Frobisher. He held his Thanksgiving celebration not for harvest but in thanks for surviving the long journey from England thru the perils of storms and iceberg. But no matter where Thanksgiving is practiced, our Thanksgiving day is a day of giving thanks for the blessing of the harvest and for the proceeding year. So I say it unto all of you — a very Happy Thanksgiving Day!

From the Clinic


Daylen is a spunky, fun six year old boy who has been coming to our clinic as a result of a mild articulation disorder. While testing of Daylen’s receptive and expressive language revealed language development within normal limits, he presented with a frontal lisp for the /s, z, sh/ and /ch/ sounds. In addition, he substituted /n/ for /l/ in all positions of words. Daylen’s parents were concerned about his speech and his ability to be understood so they brought him to our clinic.



In the past year Daylen has made exceptional progress! He has met his goals for producing /l/ in all positions of words in conversation. To do this, Daylen worked with minimal pair words, which is a technique in which words sound the same but differ by one sound. For example, Daylen’s word list include “no” and low”, “nice” and “lice”, “nap” and “lap”. Using minimal pair words helps a child understand that their production does not match the meaning they are intending. It teaches them how to self-monitor their error. During targeted drill with the /l/ minimal pair words, if Daylen said “nap” instead of “lap” I would not give him a reinforcement of his production. Thus he was able to understand that in order to make his message clear, he needed to use the /l/ instead of the /n/ or his sentence did not make semantic sense. An example would be “I want to sit in mommy’s nap” verses “I want to sit in mommy’s lap”.


Daylen is also making fantastic progress with his frontal lisp for /s, z, sh, ch/. He is now producing /s/ in the beginning and endings of words in sentences with some models. /sh/ is probably the most difficult sound for Daylen to produce at this time. We are working on tongue placement using a tongue depressor. It’s hard work but Daylen is now starting to approximate /sh/! Daylen has such a supportive and loving family. Each week one of his grandparents brings him to his treatment and the entire family helps with his homework. No wonder he is doing such a great job with such support! Great job, Daylen! Keep up the great work!

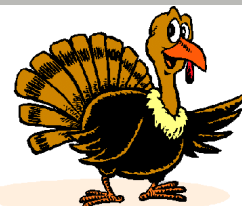

If I do not see you before the November Stated Meeting, Be well, behave, and be a good Mason

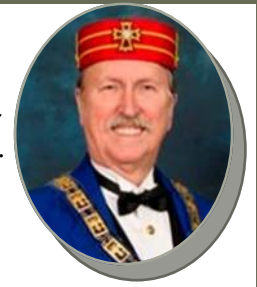

Greetings everyone!

November! A month in which we are reminded to be thankful for all we have. Our Fall Reunion is underway, starting with the 4th Degree, and, for the first time, the 6th and 7th Degrees, on October 27th. The 6th through the 22nd conferred on October 30th-31st, and the remainder on November 6th and 7th. We can be thankful for the further light that Scottish Rite has to offer.



Again I offer a bit of Masonic history/trivia for November. On November 1st, 1922, the cornerstone of the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, in Alexandria, Virginia, was laid. As you know, this is an amazing edifice and well worth our support. On November 4th, 1752, George Washington received his Entered Apprentice degree in Fredericksburg Lodge in Virginia. On November 25th, 1813, the Articles of Union of the United Grand Lodge of England were signed. On November 26th, 1737, a letter to the editor appeared in the New York Gazette newspaper, criticizing the secrecy of Freemasons and the words of the obligations' penalties (which were disclosed in a previous exposé of Freemasonry). This appears to have been the first anti-masonic effort in the colonies that were to become the United States. On November 28th, 1884, Quatuor Coronati Lodge No. 2076, in London, England, the first research lodge in the world, received its warrant. If you don't know about Quatuor Coronati, feel free to ask me. On November 28th, 1911, President-to-be Franklin D. Roosevelt (U.S. President 1933-1945) received his 3rd degree. As before, there are other Masonic events of note that happened in November and I've only mentioned a few. I hope this was of interest to you.

As Scottish Rite Masons, we should realize what makes a difference. I want to share with you the following:

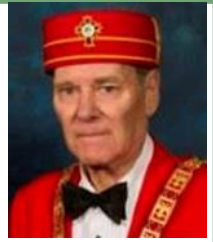

S.R. History from "California's First Century of Scottish Rite Masonry-1962" 1861-IN THE BEGINNING (Part II continued).

On July 1, 1862, when the nation was beset by the stress of the Civil War, President Lincoln signed a bill entitled "An Act to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean, and to secure to the government the use of the same for postal, military and other purposes." The final enactment of this Pacific Railroad Bill was the end of a long, vexatious, and at times apparently hopeless struggle. It was during this time of tribulation that Freemasonry blossomed forth. Records of 1863 reveal that there were about 6,000 members in California Blue Lodges. Scottish Rite Masonry had only a small representation and was not yet organized.



The Supreme Council met at Charleston, South Carolina, Thursday November 16, 1865. At the meeting Albert Pike, 33 Degree, Sovereign Grand Commander, expressed his desire for the election of an Inspector General for California. Albert G. Mackey, 33 Degree, Grand Secretary General, proposed Ebenezer Hamilton Shaw, 32 Degree, as an Active Member of the Supreme Council for California.

Shaw was then elected and invested with the dignity of the 33 Degree and rank of Sovereign Grand Inspector General for California and an Active Member of the Supreme Council for the Southern Jurisdiction.

The Supreme Council met in Washington, D.C. on April 16, 1866, at which time Shaw proposed Alexander G. Abell of California for Honorary Membership. On April 21, 1866, Shaw was authorized to confer the 33 Degree on Abell. This being done, Abell was then appointed a Special Deputy of the Sovereign Grand Inspector General for California. The Supreme Council thus established the Scottish Rite in California and this happened five years before the transcontinental railroad was completed. Shaw returned to San Francisco by steamer, and with the assistance of Alexander G. Abell, on August 4, 1866, organized California Lodge of Perfection No. 1, with William M. Rundell as Master. This was the first regular Body of Scottish Rite Masonry on the Pacific Coast.

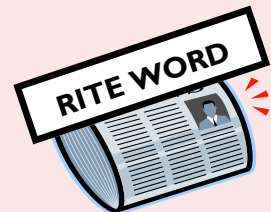
On September 8, 1866, Ebenezer H. Shaw, 33 Degree, Sovereign Grand Inspector General, conferred the degrees on twelve brethren at Marysville in Yuba County. The charter for Marysville Lodge of Perfection No. 2 was issued on November 4, 1870. In May 1883, Albert Pike, 33 Degree, Sovereign Grand Commander visited San Jose and communicated the degrees of the Lodge of Perfection to a class that had assembled in the Auzerais House, the city's leading hotel of the day. Little is known of the meeting; however, an old membership record card of Adolph Jacob Koch, found in the vault of the San Jose Temple, revealed that Koch received the Lodge of Perfection degrees by communication from Grand Commander Albert Pike on May 16, 1883. (End—of the beginning).
