#### From the Personal Representative:

ctivity at the Scottish Rite Center continues to move at a fast pace, and we are always looking for additional help to move things along. Bryant Day has joined the staff on a part time basis, and is working on the much needed system im-



provements and also helping with other tasks.

Recently two past renters informed us they would not be able to use our facilities this year because we were not able to provide WIFI connections and improved audiovisual for their planned activities. For just those two events, we lost about five times the amount it would cost to install the needed improvements so, thanks to the efforts of Bob Rowan, Dan Brothers, Bryant Day, and several contract workers, we will soon be equipped and ready. This will make our facilities much more attractive to business renters, and with the help of Arlette Nelson, our Rental Manager, we should be able to do much better in this area

We are also working to upgrade the facilities. If you had walked out on the Balcony north of the main auditorium in the past, you might have noticed that the baluster posts along the balcony rail were set too far apart for safety (a violation of the building code). While we could "get by" with a large mesh screening preventing small children from falling through the balcony railing, a mishap, if a child had managed to slip through the screening, would have put us in serious legal jeopardy. We are working now to add additional baluster posts and make the balcony more attractive, as well as bringing it up to code. Additionally, we are considering a wind screen at the west end of the balcony to cut the wind and make the area more comfortable.

We still face a difficulty with respect to the cataloging of books in the library. Bill Mundy and I are working on a solution for that problem. Dalton Noland was working diligently on organizing the library when he decided to retire, and we really miss his efforts. Meanwhile, thanks to Maury Dunbar, we continue to add to the Library.

The Clinic is very active. Our reputation keeps us with applications from all over the area. This last month our waiting list (those preparing for therapy), rose from nine to twenty-nine children. We seem to be a victim of our own success. As word of our availability spreads and parents realize what excellent work our clinicians do, they come to us seeking help for their children.

Please note the changes in the times of our Stated Meeting and Dinner. We have received many favorable comments on the new schedule, but are still trying to refine the agenda to make everyone comfortable. Let us know if you have any ideas, either as to the scheduling or the program. We are looking for ways to improve, and welcome your feed-back.

Please try to attend our Maundy Thursday celebration. It is uniquely Scottish Rite, and distinguishes us from all other branches of Masonry.

#### From the Secretaries Table:



#### Brethren,

Beginning a new year in the Secretary's office brings up a number of questions and tasks that have to be dealt with in order to move ahead with a clean slate and a good set of records. As I began the process, I realized that many of you are probably not aware of just what goes on in the Secretary's Office; why we may ask

you for information; or why we do not always have answers to your questions at our fingertips. So let me relate to you the role of the General Secretary in the Valley of San Jose as it has been described to me. (And I still have much to learn.)

The Secretary's job is very much like that of a Chief Operating Officer with the Personal Representative being the Chief Executive Officer. In his role the Secretary keeps a constant overview of the way the various components of the organization are functioning including membership service, building rentals, building maintenance, preparation and maintenance of the annual budgets, membership dues collection, and appropriate and timely responses to members' queries and special requests. In the valley of San Jose, the Secretary is also responsible for the recordkeeping of the San Jose Scottish Rite Foundation and the Valley's channels of communication with members and senior Scottish Rite administration in California as well as Washington, D.C. The Secretary is also responsible for taking and publishing the minutes of the various meetings that are held in the Valley for both the Bodies and the Foundation.

The Secretary plays an important role in preparation for the reunions and other special events such as the Mason of the Year, Sweethearts and other special events. And of course the Secretary is expected to provide the necessary administrative support to the Valley Personal Representative.

Obviously I can't do all of this by myself, but I have a very capable Administrative Assistant in Mary Lou Johnsonwho carries a good portion of the workload. In this Valley we are blessed with a Personal Representative who, plays a significant role in making planning for the future changes and improvements.

We always need your support and assistance in a number of different ways. First, obviously, please pay your annual dues promptly. As of this date only about 60% of the dues-paying members have paid their 2008 dues. Since these data are reported to Supreme Council as your dues come in to the Office; late payment of dues results in follow-up reminders being sent out from the Supreme Council, frequently after you have paid your dues.

Another critical area where we need your support is making sure that your personal data are up to date and complete and in our files. Frequently, when a question arises about a member, either as a result of a change of residence, a wish to transfer to another Valley or even another State, or even in case of a member's death, all we

#### REMEMBRANCE AND RENEWAL

The Christian world traditionally fixes the date of Easter as the first Sunday after the full moon on or after the vernal equinox (March 21). Holy Week begins with the preceding Sunday (Palm Sunday) and Maundy Thursday falls in the middle of Holy Week. The members of the Chapter of Rose Croix have, since 1866, observed Maundy Thursday as a special day, when they honor those who have passed on during the previous year.

In 1994, in deference to the Maundy, Thursday rites in churches, it was decided to replace the Scottish Rite ceremony with a non-obligatory "Celebration of Remembrance and renewal". This observance would be held near the vernal equinox, March 21.

This new ceremony is not a religious observance. It is neither the Feast of the Passover nor a Sacrament of Holy Communion, although it commemorates the spirit of both days.

Chapters of Rose Croix observe the celebration of the Mystic Banquet as a memorial service honoring those who have died during the year. This observance strengthens the ties of brotherly love, past and present. They meet together to break the bread of fraternity to reconcile themselves with those whom they may have offended, and to drink the wine of refreshment and renewal. They celebrate the lives of their departed Brethren and promise to abide by the New Law, the Law of Love, with their present Brethren and all mankind.

This year the celebration will be held on April 8, and widows of departed members will be guests for dinner and the celebration. (*See page 8 for more information*)

#### From our Clinician Michelle Crawford:

Hello family and friends !

Donny and I are happy to announce that our [not so] little baby, Aaron William Crawford, finally made his appearance at 9:15 am New Year's Day. He weighed in at 9 pounds 7.6 ounces and measured 21 inches long. We are thrilled to have him as part of our family and just wanted to share the good news. Today was our first full day home from the hospital and, despite the sleep deprivation, everyone is doing well, and we are all happy to be home.

Happy New Year everyone-- Ours certainly was THE happiest yet!

Ziana is a three and a half year old girl who has been receiving speech-language therapy at the San Jose Scottish Rite Childhood Language Clinic for four months. Ziana was diagnosed with apraxia of speech, which means she has difficulty coordinating oral movements necessary to produce sounds. As a result, she has very few intelligible words and has a difficult time making her needs and wants known, which has resulted in frustration. Prior to receiving services at Scottish Rite, three private speech therapists discontinued Ziana's treatment because of poor behavior. While Ziana continues to need treatment, she has made strong, steady progress in the last few months learning new words and using functional language to interact appropriately with others. Following are a few written comments from Ziana's mother about her experience with our clinic that was taken from a recent parent survey.

Before beginning treatment at the Scottish Rite, Ziana's mother commented that Ziana did not attempt to imitate speech, had behavioral difficulties, and refused to follow directions. Since the initiation of treatment, Ziana's mother described her daughter as "more verbal...and more willing to engage and follow directions..."


When asked to describe how Ziana's treatment has impacted their family, Ziana's mother wrote, "We can now communicate with her better since she has more words and is more willing to engage verbally. Saying 'yes' and 'my turn', 'please' have all been amazingly helpful and reduced our levels of frustration." She described her experience with services at the clinic as "a great help" and that the most rewarding aspect of Ziana's treatment is "having a very skilled and patient therapist who did not give up on Ziana in spite of her being so difficult at times and unwilling to engage." She further wrote, " [The clinician] is doing such a wonderful job with Ziana's speech and language. We are very impressed with the level of professionalism that we've seen here and are so grateful that [the clinician] is not only very skilled but also very willing to try a variety of games and techniques to engage children such as Ziana ..."

When asked if she would tell other parents about the clinic, Ziana's mother wrote, "Yes, I would and I have told other parents in our local apraxia group. The school districts are incapable of providing adequate services and parents go broke paying for private sessions over years and years. Having highly qualified speech professionals at Scottish Rite who can help our children for at least part of this most difficult journey to functional and possibly normal speech is a true blessing. Thank you!"

#### What's in a (domain) name?


Have you ever wondered what those last three letters at the end of a web address mean? When the domain naming system was first being developed, it was decided that there would only be seven reasons anyone would ever be on the Internet. .com, .edu, .gov, .int, .mil, .net, and .org were created for those purposes. Domain names may

be registered in three of these (.com, .net, and .org) without

restriction; the other four have limited purposes.

Less well known are .mil, which is used exclusively by the military, and .int which almost no-one knows about. .int is reserved exclusively for any organization formed by treaty between two or more countries. Now how's that for a specific use?!

Since the top level names were created, there have been several hundred more created which are rarely seen in this country. Every now and then you might run across a .biz, which is also for commercial use and .info which is for, well, info. Outside the U.S. you will see much more common use of country domains such as .ca for Canada, .de for Germany and .uk for the United Kingdom.

These country specific domains have been a huge windfall for the tiny island nation of Tuvalu which had the hugely good fortune to be assigned the country domain code of .tv. Tuvalu didn't even have Internet access when the letters were assigned to it, but by selling domain names that end in the very popular .tv they are slowly bringing their country into the information age.
