



reetings everyone!

It's hard to believe I'm already writing my August article. This year is flashing by...and what a pleasure it is to serve this Consistory. Thanks to all of you for your support. I want to call your attention to an event we have coming up on September 12th, at 6:00 PM at Scottish Rite. It's a MURDER MYSTERY DINNER. This is a '50's theme so feel free to come in costume. There'll be an award for best costume. Tickets are only \$25.00 but must be purchased in advance. No tickets will be sold at the door. This is a great event and I hope to see all of you there! For a bit of "August" Masonic history/trivia, on August 4th, 1753, President-to-be George Washington was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Fredericksburg Lodge in Virginia. On August 21st, 1993, the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania and thousands of Freemasons dedicated the *"Friend to Friend" Masonic Monument* in the cemetery in Gettysburg, commemorating acts of kindness between Freemasons who fought on opposite sides in the American Civil War. On August 27th, 1920, President-to-be Warren G. Harding was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Marion Lodge No. 70 in Ohio. Also in the month of August some Grand Lodges came into being: the Grand Lodge of Oregon in 1851; the Grand Lodge of Colorado in 1861; the Grand Lodge of New Mexico in 1867. On August 14th, 1826, William Morgan obtained a copyright for *Illustrations of Masonry, By One of the Fraternity Who Has Devoted Thirty Years to the Subject*, a book that publicly exposed the secrets of Masonic ritual. Although many similar books had been published before, this caused great deal of excitement, and it led to the "Morgan affair" and the Antimasonic Party of the 1820's and 1830's. Obviously there are other Masonic events of note that have happened in August. Hopefully, you find these that I just mentioned to be of interest.

I came across a writing some time back that made me think of the kinds of lessons we attain from our Scottish Rite teachings and I'd like to share it with you:

Warrior Of The Light


nute speech therapy sessions from August 2014- May 2015 secondary to an articulation disorder. Ren worked very hard on her /r/ and "th" sounds in all positions of words, sentences and in conversation over this time period. She also worked on some expressive language skills such as producing irregular past tense verbs, pronouns, question formulation, and was/were sentence formulation. Ren loved to joke around with her clinician and play with the Legos. On May 19th 2015 she met all her speech therapy goals! All her hard work paid off!! I feel sad that I do not get to see Ren as often but I am happy that she is doing so well with her speech!

Her Mother Sally wanted to say a few words about the Clinic. Here is what she had to say: "I heard about your services because my nephew attended the Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic. Before receiving services at this clinic Ren's speech was very difficult to understand. Since treatment began it has gotten so much better! Speech treatment has impacted our family on a daily basis because everyone understands her better now! The most rewarding part about receiving services here is the love that Miss Jenna showed to our family. It was a wonderful experience and I would recommend it to anyone who might need the help. Thank you to the San Jose Scottish Rite Clinic for offering this service."

Ren's younger sister Brielle was screened here at our Clinic in May 2015 and is now on our wait list. I hope I get to work with Brielle in the future, or at least see her big lovely family in the waiting room very soon!

THE RITE WORD

The July trip to the "USS Hornet" aircraft carrier in Oakland was quite nice. Arriving on board at noon and viewing the initial video session we chose one of the three "guided tours" available. Each tour holds about 30 visitors and ours was the below decks engine room tour. It takes two and $\frac{1}{2}$ hours and all of the below waterline engine machinery equipment and technology required to power the ship was explained in detail. This was the first time we had ever seen engine room systems and it was really amazing.



A tour like this would be a wonderful experience for children and families whose "kids" might eventually want to have such a naval career. Several other tours include Naval aircraft, Gemini and Apollo spaceflight capsules. Also the three decks "topside" where all the ship command, combat, navigation, communication and radar systems are explained in detail. The next time I visit the Hornet I want to try the aircraft flight simulator and out what it must be like to take off and land on the deck of carrier.

Another reason I wanted to make this trip was to have Naval Chaplain John W. Berger, CDR (Ret.) sign my 32nd degree S.R. book. He is an exceptionally well known and well loved person and a 50 year Chaplain in the U.S. Navy, but I was told that he had just passed away the previous week. However, that his funeral service would be held at Willow Glen Funeral in two days.

So—several of us attended the service and I was able to say a few words about Scottish Rite and why I was there. I met his family and they were very pleased and that they would sign my book in his place. I ended my talk with the words "Oh Johnny, I hardly knew thee, but we will always remember you." Thus ended my second trip to the USS Hornet
