From the Clinic



anon is an adorable nine year old girl who has been seen at the San Jose Scottish Rite Childhood Language Disorders Clinic for cleft palate and a severe expressive communication disorder. Initially Manon came to our clinic with no words and only the sounds /m/, /h/ and the vowel /a/. She did not use any words with the exception of /mama/ for "mommy" and /aa/ for

"daddy". Manon has made exceptional progress with her speech skills given the severity of her communication disorder. She is one of the most loving and spirited children in our clinic with a radiant smile and a fun personality. She is such a pleasure to see every week. And it has been wonderful watching her grow in her communication skills!




Manon's parents heard about our clinic from another family. Her mother reported that Manon's speech and language skills were "very limited" prior to services at our clinic and "her confidence was low and she was frustrated." Since treatment began Manon has increased her sound system to include the sounds /n, b, p/ in addition to the /m/ and / h/ sounds. She has increased her expressive vocabulary to include nearly 50 words and is now using two-word phrases despite her limited sound system. Given Manon's diagnosis of cleft palate, treatment requires specific therapeutic techniques to facilitate progress. Manon's family is always supportive and up for the task of working with Manon at home so that progress is continual.

When asked about her thoughts regarding the therapy Manon has received from our clinic, Manon's mother was so kind and gracious. "Our family has been greatly impacted. We are so grateful for the positive changes Rachel has been able to bring to our daughter and family. She can express herself more directly...The kindness, support and knowledge that Rachel has been able to share with us [has] helped Manon to grow her speech skills and language. Rachel's patience and determination is a blessing. Our family's experience has been positive. We have seen tremendous progress and gains in our daughter. The ability to gain more verbal skills and communication has relieved her frustration and allowed her personality to bloom. Rachel and Jenna are highly skilled and very supportive. They develop great relationships with the families. I know our family could not financially support the services we receive at the Scottish Rite clinic. We are so thankful for the services we have been lucky enough to receive. It has been life changing for our entire family but most of all has given our daughter a real chance to improve and grow in a way that can only be understood by the people in her life. From the Master of Kadosh

In Sufi circles, it is customary for students to soak themselves in stories set for their study, so that the internal dimensions may be unlocked by the teaching master as, and when, the candidate is judged ready for the experiences which they bring. Most fables contain at least some truth and often enable people to absorb ideas which the ordinary patterns of their thinking would prevent them from digesting. Fables have therefore been used, not least by the Sufiteachers, to present a picture of life more in harmony with their feelings than is possible by means of intellectual exercises. Sound familiar?



The Blind Ones and the Matter of the Elephant!

Beyond Ghor there was a city. All its inhabitants were blind. A king with his entourage arrived nearby. He brought his army and camped in the desert. He had a mighty elephant, which he used in attack and to increase the people's awe. The populace became anxious to see the elephant, and some sightless from among this blind community ran like fools to find it. As they did not even know the form or shape of the elephant, they groped it sightlessly to gather information about it from its several different parts! Each thought that he knew something, because he could feel a part. When they returned to their fellow-citizens eager groups clustered around them. Each of these was anxious, misguidedly, to learn the truth from those who were themselves astray. ! They asked about the form, the shape of the elephant: and listened to all that they were told.! The man whose hand had reached an ear was asked about the elephant's nature. He said: It is a large, rough thing, wide and broad, like a rug.'! And the one who had felt the trunk said: 'I have the real facts about it. It is like a straight and hollow pipe, awful and destructive.'! The one who had felt its feet and legs said: 'It is might and firm, like a pillar.'! Each had felt one part out of many. Each had perceived it wrongly. No mind knew all: knowledge is not the companion of the blind. All imagined something - something incorrect! The created is not informed about divinity. There is no Way in this science by means of the ordinary intellect.!

This tale is more famous in Rumi's version-"The Elephant in the Dark House,' found in the Mathnavi. Rumi's teacher Hakim Sanai gives this earlier treatment in the first book of his Sufi classic, *The Walled Garden of Truth*. He died in 1150.! Both stories are themselves renderings of a similar argument which, according to traditions, has been used by Sufi teaching masters for centuries.

This holiday was started by the Grand Army of the Republic which was a Union group from Illinois. They would decorate the graves of the fallen soldiers of war with flowers. Due to rivaling dates between the Union and Confederates on when this day should fall, there was a date finally set which we know as Memorial Day (the last Monday in May). This day united the Union and the Confederates in honoring fallen soldiers on

both sides of the war. This day is not to be confused with Veterans Day, which celebrates the U.S. Military Veterans. We will notice the flag of the United States moving several times this day. As most of you are probably aware by now, we will be having just ONE Reunion in 2016. The dates are: June 17-18, 25 and 29: The schedule is as follows:


Jun 17: 4-7 Degrees Jun 18: 8-18 Degrees Jun 25:19-30 Degrees Jun 29: 31-32 Degrees
