While surfing the web, I came across a very interesting Scottish Rite website. It was the Valley of Indianapolis and they have a cathedral. Before you take a big deep breath and say



"WHAAA....", it is not a church. It is one of the largest Masonic buildings ever constructed, built in 1927 and is typical of Neo-Gothic architecture. There is a picture of this building on the website and yes, my brothers, it does look like a church. However, it also looks somewhat like a castle. This building was built with every dimension (in feet) being evenly divisible by three. They have a 54-bell carillon, 15 pillars holding up the second floor and a ballroom of 99 feet square. If you think that this is unique, they also have a Scottish Rite Orchestra in residence that is still playing today. The orchestra was made up of Scottish Rite members until 2002 when music participation became a problem. It was then opened to the public and they now have a 47 musician orchestra. This is a great example of a Valley of Scottish Rite. Below is a link that you too can see this very impressive building.



Let me start by welcoming our newest 32° Masters of the Royal Secret! We have conferred our Degrees and our reunion is over. My compliments to all the members of the degree teams for their outstanding efforts in putting on these degrees. Well done.

For a bit of "June" Masonic history/trivia, on June 4th, 1820, President-to-be James K.

Polk was initiated in Columbia Lodge No. 31 in Columbia, Tennessee. On June 5th, 1923, the ground breaking took place for the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandra, VA. (If you ever have the opportunity, you should visit. And I always encourage that we give generously to support this preeminent Masonic edifice.) On June 11th, 1986, the Grand Lodge of England required the removal of references to the physical penalties from all obligations. On June 20th, 1881, Albert G. Mackey, Masonic author and Secretary-General of the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America was called from labor. On June 23rd, 1780, Wolfgang Goethe was initiated in Amalia Lodge, Weimer, Germany. On this same date in the year 1717, what is referred to as the premiere Grand Lodge was formed in London, at the Goose and Gridiron Ale-house. Also on this same date in 1734, Benjamin Franklin became Grand Master of what would be known as the "Moderns" Grand Lodge in Pennsylvania. And, on June 28th, 1901, President-to-be Warren G. Harding was initiated in Marion Lodge No. 70 in Ohio. Obviously there are other Masonic events of note that have happened in June, but they are too numerous to mention. Hopefully, you find those

From the Clinic

Tanish is a sweet and hardworking 12 and a half year-old boy. He is receiving twice a week speech therapy services secondary to a diagnosis of an Autism Spectrum Disorder and an Intellectual Disability. He is currently working on appropriately answering "What" and "Where



is it?" questions. In addition, he is also working on producing requests with appropriate sentence length. Most days he increases his performance by answering questions correctly that he had been working on for weeks. He responds well to visual and auditory supports when working on his

goals. Tanish has a great ear for music, rhythm and scales. We usually spend our last five minutes singing musical patterns or tapping them out on the table with our hands. He is highly motivated to give his best effort so that I can spend the last bit of our session imitating whatever challenging musical movements he throws at me! He is a delight to work with and his nanny says that he looks forward to coming here each week. Please read what his parents wrote about our clinic and services below.

Dear San Jose Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic,

My wife and I heard about the clinic through a friend who's child benefited from the San Jose Scottish Rite Clinic. Before receiving services at this clinic our son, Tanish had very limited verbal language skills. Unless he was prompted, he would manage to get things done in a non-verbal way. Speech therapy at this clinic has helped Tanish use more verbal communication. While his ability to use group language skills has been limited and very slow to progress, he has been slowly making improvements. Treatment at this clinic has impacted our family as it is helping Tanish become a little bit more of a verbal communicator, reducing the amount of frustration and tantrums, and is increasing his ability to articulate daily. The most rewarding thing about receiving speech services at this clinic is that Tanish is using sentences instead of single words for his communication. Our experience with the San Jose Scottish Rite Speech and Language Clinic has been very good. We have never seen any non-profit service that is so professional. Tanish's clinician, Jenna Mendonca, is very professional and she takes great interest in small details of language learning. Knowing successive therapy sessions would help Tanish, she accommodated her schedule to make a way. We are very happy with our Scottish Rite speech services because their approach helps kids develop and comprehend language skills. We are very thankful for the San Jose Scottish Rite Clinic for providing services with such dedicated and professional staff.


