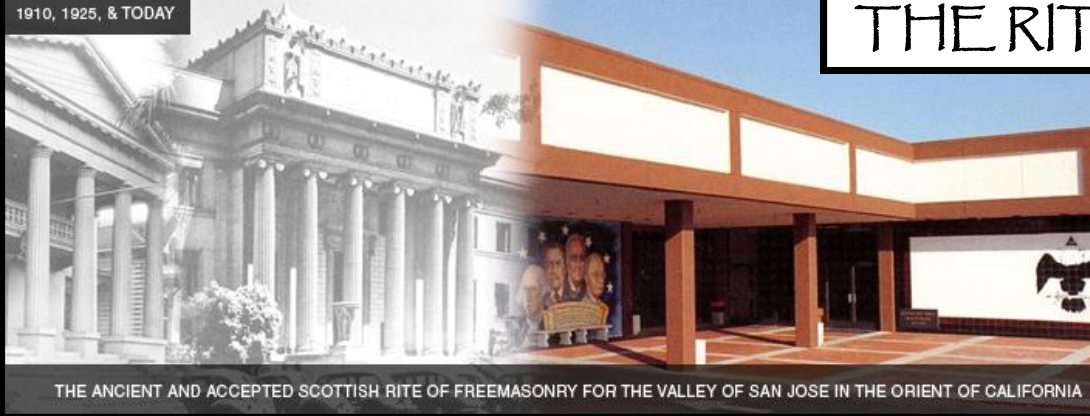

Our Fall Reunion begins on October 9, 2012 with the conferral of the Fourth Degree following the monthly stated meeting. The Masonic Restoration Foundation (MRF) held their third annual symposium on August 23-26 at the Oakland Scottish Rite Temple. I hope some you had the opportunity to attend. The four day event hosted by Academia Lodge No 847 included scholarly papers, the conferral of the Fellow Craft Degree in Traditional Observance Lodge manner, a Lodge of Instruction and several great dinners including a formal agape. Closing remarks on Sunday, Aug 26, were made by Very Worshipful John L. Cooper the Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of California.

A few words about the MRF are probably in order for those of you who might not be familiar with the organization. Since 2001, the MRF has been conducting research on the problems affecting American masonry, identifying successful practices and offering realistic solutions aimed at reversing negative trends. The MRF have interviewed hundreds of young men about their perceptions of Masonry and what they seek in the lodge experience. They are aware that many young men who are joining the fraternity today have generally already done a lot of reading and website

surfing and have formulated an opinion about the fraternity.

Most of these young men perceive Freemasonry as a place for truth-seeking, a way to seek self-improvement and realize spiritual development. These young Brothers know what they want from a fraternity and have high expectations that their lodge will meet their needs as men.

The MRF provides education and training to individuals, lodges and Grand Lodges on ways to establish quality programs, academic excellence and social relevance in their Masonic communities that will be a match with the needs of the new Mason.

In addition, the MRF provides certification for lodges seeking to become a traditional observance (T.O.) lodge. The MRF has established requirements and tenets for a T.O. lodge to follow which affords the lodge the opportunity to establish an initiatic focus and Masonic culture dedicated to the preservation of traditional forms practiced by our ancient masters.

Next month I am going to discuss a few ideas about "sacred space" and our Masonic temples. I look forward to seeing you at the September 11 Stated Meeting and Dinner.

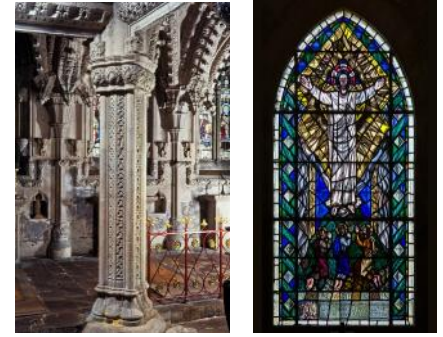




From the Secretary's Table:

Osvaldo is an engaging and well-mannered, ten year old young man who has been coming to our clinic for speech and language therapy for the past year. His mother was referred to the San Jose Scottish Rite clinic by Osvaldo's teacher. She brought in Osvaldo and his two brothers for a speech and language screening. All three boys were placed on

our waitlist, and when treatment spots became available only 2 of the boys still needed help. Osvaldo and his older brother Andrew have both been receiving individual speech and language therapy and occasionally they are seen together, as many of their treatment goals overlap.

Osvaldo's speech and language goals have spanned across several areas. One of Osvaldo's areas of need has been articulation. He had difficulty with the /s/ and /z/ sounds and produced them with a lisp quality, meaning his tongue placement was too far forward and protruding between his teeth. Osvaldo has also required help with his expressive and receptive language skills. It is difficult for Osvaldo to choose the correct vocabulary and grammar to construct sentences and conversation. He has worked on several grammatical aspects of language such as verb tenses, prepositions and possessive nouns and pronouns. His goals have also targeted auditory processing deficits such as following directions, sequencing, phonological blending of sounds, word discrimination and word memory.

Improvement has been noted for all of Osvaldo's goals, especially his articulation skills. He continues to need help with his language and auditory processing skills. His mother noted that Osvaldo's speech and language has improved and that he now speaks clearly and corrects his own errors.

With his great attitude and willingness to participate, Osvaldo has made and continues to make great progress. He also receives special services at school to address his speech, language and academic needs. Osvaldo's progress has been a result of his combined services as well as the support he receives at home from his family. He is a joy to work with and continued success is sure to continue!



Clinic Director's Message September 2012

Year-to-date your clinic has served 97 children. During the month of July, we completed 202 treatment hours. A total of 50 children received speech and language services. We also carried out four (4) more screening evaluations. We discharged two children from our services and two children were added to the caseload from the waiting list, leaving a total of 118 children on our waiting list.

Presently, we have nine (9) screenings scheduled. Once these screening have been completed, we anticipate closing the waiting list due to the high number of children awaiting our help. We hope to reopen the waiting list and conduct additional screenings again starting in late Fall or early Winter.

We are also attempting contact the Rainbow Girls, who had previously expressed interest in carrying out volunteer work at the Clinic. The Clinic Staff and I are hopeful that we will be able to make arrangements for the Rainbow Girls to assist in the near future.

Thanks again to each of you for your help for and support of our Clinic.

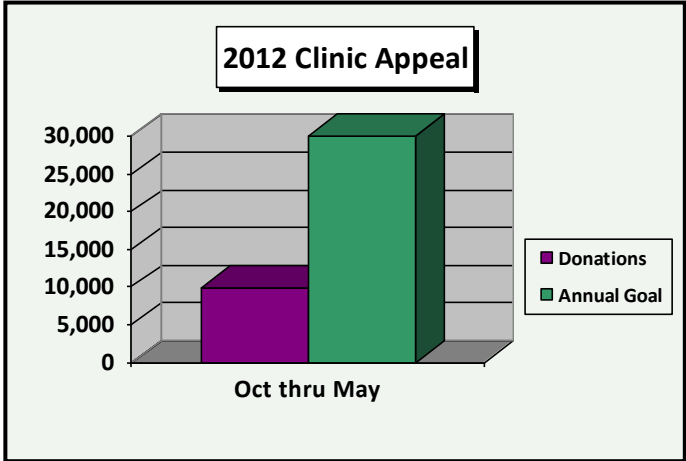
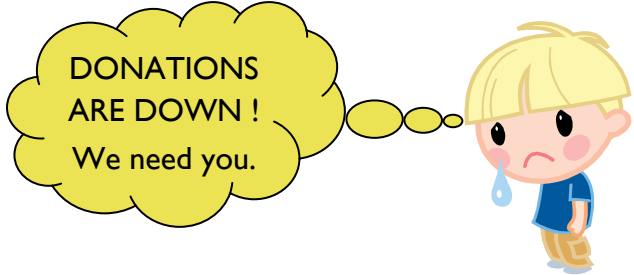

Let us, on September 11, 2012 at mid-day have a moment of silence in remembrance for all our lost friends, families and fellow Americans on that tragic day. Let us pay our respects by never forgetting the past but focus and fight for our future.

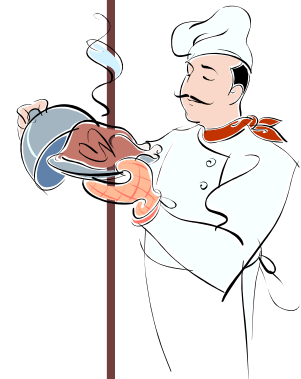
